2024 TAX LEVY RESOLUTION

Dr. Cunningham stated the following:

Good evening everyone,

I would like to start by wishing you all a very Happy Holidays! With only three days left until our much-anticipated vacation, I thought we could kick off tonight's meeting with something fun: Dual Credit Trivia!

Before we dive into the game, let me explain what dual credit is. Dual credit is an instructional arrangement where an academically qualified high school student enrolls in a college-level course and, upon successful completion, earns both college credit and high school credit. Now, let's get started with the trivia!

- **Question 1:** True or False? Dual credit is generally taken by high schoolers in-person at a community college.
- *Answer:* False. According to Mr. Porter, he is correct. 72% of dual credit course-takers take it at their high school. Only about 17% take it at a college campus or facility, and 5% take it online.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

- ****Question 2:**** True or False? Dual credit is accessed evenly through 4-year and 2-year institutions.
- *Answer:* False. As Mr. Fickes correctly noted, 97% of dual credit course-takers participate in community college courses, with only 3% participating in 4-year institutions.
- **Ouestion 3:** Which dual credit course is most popular?
- *Options:*
- 1. Spanish
- 2. General Writing
- 3. Welding Technology
- 4. Psychology
- *Answer:* General Writing, as correctly answered by Dr. Doss.
- **Question 4:** True or False? Dual credit is offered by most high schools in Illinois.
- *Answer:* True. Only 24 districts in the state had no dual credit participation, and thank you to Mr. Horton for getting it right.
- **Question 5:** What proportion of dual credit courses count for Career and Technical Education credit?
- *Options:*
- 12%
- 23%
- 37%
- 52%
- *Answer: * 37%, correctly answered by Mr. Fickes.
- **Question 6:** True or False? Research has found that dual credit participation improves college enrollment, achievement, and completion.
- *Answer:* True. As Mr. Fickes correctly mentioned, this is why understanding and improving dual credit access and equity is so important.

Dual credit has significant benefits:

- **High school outcomes:** Higher academic performance, increased attendance, and enhanced college readiness.
- **College outcomes:** Higher enrollment rates, more credit accumulation, and reduced time to degree completion.

Despite these benefits, there are still dual credit inequities, particularly in urban schools, those with high percentages of students eligible for Free/Reduced-Price Lunch, and schools with higher proportions of Black and Latino students. We must continue to work towards improving access and equity in dual credit programs.

In our district, the Dual Credit program is expanding. Currently, District 205 offers 16 articulated Dual Credit courses with South Suburban College, Moraine Valley Community College, and Joliet Junior College. We are planning to further expand our offerings in Vocational Education, English, Social Sciences, and Fine Arts.

Our work in dual credit has not gone unnoticed. At the recent Triple I conference, I was honored to speak alongside two other superintendents about our district's success in increasing student participation in Dual Credit. Congratulations to our

curriculum department for their excellent work and thank you for your continued efforts to expand these opportunities for our students.
