
In addition, if your comments are of a critical nature about specific people, the Board requests that you present your comments during the personnel portion of the "executive session."



Economic Students Visit The Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago

On December 4th, Thornton Economics students from Mr. Feltz's and Ms. Jones' class had the opportunity to visit the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago Money Museum and meet with a Federal Reserve Vice President of the Bank Supervision Department. She presented on the role of the Federal Reserve, showed a short video highlighting the goals and role of the Federal Reserve and answered student questions. Afterwards, students went through a variety of exhibits including spotting a counterfeit bill and acting as the Federal Open Market Committee member voting on the appropriate adjustment of interest rates. They also got to see a million dollars in \$1 dollar bills, \$20 dollar bills, and \$100 dollar bills. Students were also able to see currency dating as far back as the American Revolutionary War.
















TRADE SCHOOL THURSDAY'S MEDICAL DAY






