

Good Day,

I am excited to be here at Letchworth Central School! Thank you for having me. My name is Jay Ballard, and I am the Transportation Coordinator at Letchworth Central School District and PCS terminals. To help you get to know me and my background, here are a few details.

I am originally from Hume, NY, and graduated from Fillmore Central School. My two siblings and I grew up on a dairy/horse farm there, where I was raised with a strong work ethic, for which I am grateful as an adult. As a farm kid, I developed a passion for mechanics and operating equipment, a skill that continued throughout high school under Mr. Mehlenbacher, as well as through 4-H and FFA programs.



I enrolled in the Heavy Equipment Truck and Diesel Program at Alfred State College on the SUNY Wellsville Campus, where I graduated in 1992. I then worked in my field of study from 1992 to 1998, at two different companies. My first role was at Ashford Concrete in Springville, NY, where I worked as a fleet mechanic, and later as a fabricator, building new concrete trucks. In this role, I worked heavily with hydraulics and electrical systems, building trucks for purchasing companies.

Afterward, I transitioned to Genesis Transportation, a local company in Silver Springs/Rock Glen, NY, where I worked as a fleet mechanic/fabricator. Along the way, I acquired my CDL Class A license and drove Toter semi-trucks, transporting oversized loads all over the East Coast.

On July 1, 1998, I was hired as the Transportation Supervisor at Hinsdale Central School in Cattaraugus County, where I worked until June 30, 2010. From July 1, 2010, to June 30, 2016, I served as the Transportation Supervisor at Wellsville Central School. Then, from July 1, 2016, to September 30, 2024, I was the Transportation Supervisor at Geneseo Central School, bringing me to 26 years of experience in this role at these regional schools. Over the years, I have gained valuable knowledge and experience and had the opportunity to earn certifications that have allowed me to test and train school bus drivers at any required level, as well as to train other trainers/

In 2005, I was given the opportunity to work for CTS Inc., a company based in Chautaugua County that provides school bus training and testing to BOCES and school districts across WNY. I continue to work for CTS in a limited capacity, serving them since 2005.

I am blessed and grateful for this opportunity to be here at what I consider home, at LCS, doing what I love. I am looking forward to serving your families and communities well, as my family resides in the Perry School District within the Township of Castile. I am also blessed to work with a great transportation staff at both terminals. Thank you all for this exciting opportunity.


WINTER CHEERLEADING 2025
