Dear Wellesley Alumna,

We are delighted to invite you to join us on this splendid voyage from Sicily to Venice, as we visit iconic sites associated with the legacy of the Greco-Roman world, explore traditional towns and villages in the Italian Puglia, and discover the remarkable influence of Venice along the Dalmatian Coast.

Throughout the voyage, Wellesley Professor of Classical Studies **Bryan Burns** will share his experience and expertise in a series of lectures providing context for the ancient remains you visit and insights into what we know of the men and women who built them. Joining Bryan as a guest lecturer will be Wellesley alumna **Lynn Sherr**, '63, who studied Greek as a student and later became a member of the Board of Trustees. Lynn will offer some thoughts on lessons learned in the course of her long career as a journalist and best-selling author.

Setting forth from Palermo, you will sail to Lipari, largest of the Aeolian Islands, mythological home of the Greek god of the winds, and to Stromboli, an active volcano whose pyrotechnics still illuminate the night sky. The lofty resort town of Taormina, with its renowned Greco-Roman theater, awaits you on Sicily's eastern shore, before you reach Puglia for visits to a remarkable series of small ports and towns that reveal Italy's abiding embrace of traditions that defy the passage of time.

Crossing the Adriatic to Croatia, your first port of call is Dubrovnik, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Europe's best-preserved medieval cities, where a full day's visit is followed by a cruise through the scenic Bay of Kotor to Montenegro's historic port. The legendary sites of Split, Hvar, and Rovinj reveal why the Dalmatian Coast is one of Europe's most fascinating cruise destinations. And then you arrive in Venice—bella Venezia, la Serenissima, the jewel of the Adriatic—for a day of inexhaustible wonder.

Your vessel for this extraordinary voyage is Swan Hellenic's *Diana*, a state-of-the-art, new-generation expedition cruise ship. Launched in April of 2023, *Diana* welcomes guests in beautifully appointed staterooms and balcony suites. Featuring several lounges, an outstanding restaurant, outdoor café, spa, and library. *Diana* is also equipped with the latest safety and environmentally-friendly technology. Please join fellow Wellesley alumnae, Lynn Sherr, and Professor Burns on this thoughtfully designed voyage of discovery and rediscovery of the ancient world.

# WELLESLEY GUEST LECTURERS

### **PROFESSOR BRYAN BURNS**

Classics Department



Bryan Burns is Professor of Classical Studies at Wellesley College, where he teaches courses on the representation of myths in Greek art, interaction between regions of the ancient Mediterranean, and the changing methods of archeological research. An active archaeologist, he also leads an excavation

at ancient Eleon, where he and his team have uncovered houses and tombs of the Mycenaean period (1700-1100 BCE), and a religious shrine of the Classical period (500 BCE). Burns is particularly interested in how ancient Greek societies made connections across space and through time, an interest that will be especially valuable on our voyage to regions far removed from the center of Greek civilization in the Aegean.

# **LYNN SHERR**Wellesley alumna



Award-winning journalist and best-selling author Lynn Sherr '63 spent more than thirty years with ABC News, covering a wide range of stories – from women's issues and social change to investigative reports, politics and the space program. Her writing has appeared in numerous publications, including *The* 

New York Times and The Washington Post. She has also cohosted a podcast (She Votes) examining the ongoing role of women in politics. And she continues to report on a variety of platforms, and to lecture across the country.

At Wellesley, Lynn was a Greek major and *News* editor, and later a member of the Board of Trustees. She has delivered two commencement addresses at the college, and previously accompanied Wellesley alumnae on a trip to Tanzania.

Her books include Sally Ride: America's First Woman in Space; America the Beautiful: The Stirring, True Story Behind Our Nation's Favorite Song; SWIM: Why We Love the Water and Tall Blondes: A Book About Giraffes, which was also the subject of a one-hour documentary she hosted for the PBS Nature program.














**Built in Finland, and launched in April 2023, Swan Hellenic's** *Diana* is a new generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 12,100 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 350 passengers, *Diana* will accommodate a maximum of 192 guests in 96 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Diana* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Diana* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 135 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Diana* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Diana's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections and other amenities. Of the ship's 96 staterooms, 76 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of- the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.

# Thursday, August 21

# **PALERMO**, Sicily

Arrive in Palermo and transfer to the elegant *Grand Hotel Wagner* (or similar), your home for the night. Gather with our Wellesley faculty leader and fellow travelers this evening for a welcome dinner. (D)

# Friday, August 22

# PALERMO/EMBARKATION

Palermo is one of the Mediterranean's most enchanting cities. Founded by the Phoenicians in 827 BC and conquered by the Saracens in the 9th century, Palermo became one of Europe's greatest cities in the 12th century, under Norman rule. Enjoy a tour of Palermo, including a visit to Cappella Palatina, the royal chapel built by Roger II between 1132 and 1143. A wonder of Byzantine-Arab-Norman artistry, it features dazzling mosaics, an exquisitely carved wooden ceiling, and magnificent inlaid marble floors and walls. In the afternoon, transfer to the pier to embark *Diana*. (B,L,D)

# Saturday, August 23

#### LIPARI/STROMBOLI, Aeolian Islands

Lipari is the largest and most populous of the Aeolian Islands, and according to Greek mythology, the home of Aeolus, God of the winds. Visit the 16th-century Norman castle that sits atop the town's ancient acropolis and houses the Aeolian Archaeological Museum, displaying finds from all of the islands to illustrate the evolution of the archipelago as an active volcano system. In the evening, *Diana* will cruise by the island of Stromboli, affording views of its volcanic activity against the night sky. (B,L,D)

# Sunday, August 24

### **GIARDINI NAXOS/TAORMINA, Sicily**

Giardini Naxos is your gateway to Taormina, one of Italy's most attractive hill towns. A maze of narrow streets, splashed with the vibrant colors of bougainvillea and oleander, the site has attracted the attention of many civilizations over the centuries. Tour the town, including the magnificent Greek theater, still in use for concerts today, as well as other sites. (B,L,D)

## Monday, August 25

### GALLIPOLI/LECCE, Puglia

After a morning at sea and lunch aboard ship, arrive in Puglia's Gallipoli for an excursion to Lecce, one of many cities and towns in Puglia that rightfully boast of their dazzling Baroque architecture. Visit the Piazza del Duomo and Cathedral, the Basilica of Santa Croce, and the Amphitheater in Piazza Oronzo. Return to Gallipoli, reminiscent of Greek fishing towns in the Aegean, and enjoy some time at leisure to explore on your own. (B,L,D)

### Tuesday, August 26

### MONOPOLI/ALBEROBELLO/LOCOROTONDO, Puglia

The fishing town of Monopoli, dominated by a castle built in 1552,



is your gateway to the region's trulli villages, with their curious dwellings. Alberobello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is perhaps the most famous of these towns, featuring over 1,500 of the remarkable white-washed structures with pyramidal, conical, or domed roofs built of corbelled local limestone without mortar, using a prehistoric building technique that has survived to this day. Also visit nearby Locorotondo, frequently cited as one of the most beautiful towns in Italy. Set on a hilltop, its stone-paved streets lead to a pedestrian historic center where the lovely public garden offers panoramic views of the surrounding Valle d'Itria. (B,L,D)

# Wednesday, August 27

### **DUBROVNIK**, Croatia

Set on a rocky peninsula jutting into the Adriatic Sea, Dubrovnik is one of Europe's best-preserved medieval cities and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Its ancient walls enclose narrow cobblestoned streets and alleyways, palaces, and mansions. The city contains within its ramparts the Rector's Palace; the Franciscan Monastery, which houses a 13th-century pharmacy (the oldest in Europe); and the baroque Cathedral, with works by Renaissance painters Titian and Andrea del Sarto. *Diana* is in port until late in the evening, providing ample opportunity to continue exploration of this fascinating city on your own, and perhaps to have a meal ashore as well. (B,L,D)

# Thursday, August 28

## **KOTOR**, Montenegro

Sail the fjord-like Bay of Kotor to reach the Montenegrin port town of the same name, located at the head of the bay beneath towering mountains. One of the most striking and best-preserved towns along the Adriatic coast, Kotor is also designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A tour of this delightful town reveals its magnificent walls, palaces, and churches, including the Drago Palace, with its elegant Renaissance windows, the 12th-century St. Tryphon Cathedral, and the baroque Lipovac Palace. (B,L,D)

# Friday, August 29

### SPLIT/HVAR, Croatia

This morning, *Diana* docks in Split, an ancient city built around the formidable Palace of Diocletian, constructed between 295 and 305. An extensive structure, much of it well-preserved, the palace contains

within its walls Split's medieval town, making it the only palace that has been continuously inhabited since Roman times. Over lunch, the ship sails to Hvar, a fertile island of stone houses surrounded by rosemary, lavender, and laurel. Your tour of the island's principal town includes the 17th-century Municipal Theater, the Franciscan Monastery, the city's Loggia, and St. Stephen's Square. (B,L,D)

## Saturday, August 30

### **ROVINJ, ISTRIA, CROATIA**

After a morning at sea, arrive in Rovinj, which was for centuries the center of Venetian control of the Istrian Peninsula. It continues to display Venetian influence in its architecture and urban design. Explore this attractive town, including the Baroque Basilica of Saint Euphemia, which house the saint's relics, brought here from Constantinople in the 9th century, and explore Rovinj's narrow streets and alleyways. As in Dubrovnik, *Diana* remains in port until late in the evening. (B,L,D)

# Sunday, August 31


# **VENICE**, Italy

Be on deck as the *Diana* sails in the morning into Venice. In the morning, explore St. Mark's Basilica and the Doge's Palace. The interior of the Basilica is covered with 14,000 square feet of gold mosaics, and the altarpiece known as Pala d'Oro is universally considered the most refined expression of Byzantine sensibility in the world. The Doge's Palace, combining Gothic, Renaissance, and Mannerist elements, was the working center of Venetian government when Venice dominated the entire eastern Mediterranean. Following lunch aboard, visit the Scuola Grande di San Rocco, whose walls and ceilings are covered with murals by Tintoretto, and the Basilica Santa Maria Gloriosa dei Frari, which, despite its rather plain exterior, contains a treasure trove of paintings and sculptures by artists including Titian, Canova, Sansovino, Donatello, and Bellini. Overnight aboard the ship, docked in Venice. (B,L,D)

# Monday, September 1

#### VENICE/DISEMBARK

After breakfast aboard, disembark and transfer to the airport for flights homeward. (B)



All accommodations aboard *Diana* are spacious staterooms and balcony suites. They are elegantly decorated, face outside, affording sea views, and include a queen-size bed that can be arranged as two twin beds, a spacious bathroom, minirefrigerator, safe, ample closet space, climate control, telephone, TV, Wi-Fi, and USB connections, as well as other amenities.


