March 3, 2025

The District 4 Board of Trustees held its regular meeting Monday, March 3, at 6:00 p.m. at the District Office. Agenda notice was distributed to Spartanburg Herald Journal, Woodruff Times, Post and Courier and listed on the District website at spartanburg4.org/do/agenda.

Chairman Tony Davis called the meeting to order. The minutes of the February 3 meeting were approved.

The following reports were presented:

Woodruff Primary School

Mrs. Dover gave the following report:

- 1. Calendar of Events for March 2025 is attached.
- 2. WPS students and staff have collected approximately 300 items for Spartanburg Humane Society.
- 3. WPS Science Fair was held February 17th and 18th. Fourteen first and second graders entered projects. Any student who placed first, second, or third place in their category was eligible to enter the Piedmont Region III Science Fair at USC Upstate. - 4. Preschool and kindergarten enrollment will be held on Thursday, March 13th from 8:30 a.m. 2:00 p.m. in the Activity Center. Students new to Woodruff Primary School for the 2025-2026 school year should be enrolled on this day. Parents of students already enrolled do not need to attend.
- 5. Twenty-three second graders qualified to take the Performance Task Assessment (PTA) in order to qualify for the gifted and talented program in third grade. PTA was administered from Tuesday, February 18th until Friday, February 20th. Results will be received later in the spring.
- 6. WPS students are fortunate to participate in many field trip opportunities this year. Students have plans to visit Lake Conestee Nature Park, Roebuck Skate Center (STEM Program), Greenville Zoo, and Strawberry Hill in the spring.
- 7. Thanks to a grant from Celanese, kindergarten through second grade students will be able to participate in an in-house STEM experience provided by Spartanburg Science Center in May.
- 8. WPS teachers have been working with WHS Teacher Cadets to provide opportunities for observations. They will begin field placements soon and observe each morning Monday – Thursday, with opportunities to teach two lessons. We look forward to hosting them!

Mrs. Parris reported the following:

- 1. Read Across America March 3-7th. The students will wear their favorite hat, silly socks, wacky clothes, dress in what you want to be when you grow up, and their craziest hair style.
- 2. Mrs. Newton and Mrs. Baxter administered WIDA Access Testing to our ML students during the month of February.
- 3. 24- 3rd graders, 18- 4th graders, and 31- 5th graders qualified to take the South Carolina Performance Task Assessment for Academic Gifted and Talented Identification. This is based on meeting the required state criteria and includes verbal and nonverbal task assessments. Student results will be returned late spring and will determine if students qualify for Soar placement for the 2025-2026 school year.
- 4. In the month of February, third grade students worked diligently on a research project and presentation for Black History Month. They each chose a historical or noteworthy figure, conducted research, organized their findings, and compiled their ideas into a final project. Students wore their **Red-Carpet** attire on their presentation day.
 - Mrs. Cole, Ms. McNeely, Mrs. Baynes, Mrs. McKoy's, and Ms. West's homeroom classes presented their projects at 8:15 on Tuesday, February 25, 2025. Parents will need to exit the school before 8:45.
 - Ms. Grier, Mrs. Robinson, Mrs. Silver, and Ms. Smith's homeroom classes I presented their projects at 9:15 on Tuesday, February 25, 2025. Parents will need to exit the school before 9:45.
- 5. 5th Grade Students will attend the Link Up Concert on March 4th, at Converse University

- 6. We are going to have designated days for students to invite a "buddy" or two to breakfast. This is called "Breakfast Buddies." Instructional Reports

Mr. Russell Mahaffey reported the following:

- 1. Principals have conducted mid-year evaluation conferences with teachers and discussed progress toward the Student Learning Objectives (SLOs). According to the ADEPT timeline, the ending date for final evaluation conferences is April 25.
- 2. The last teacher induction class was held on Thursday, February 13 from 3:00 6:00pm. The teachers worked with the 12 standards in the Instruction Domain throughout the last class session in February. Teachers videotaped themselves teaching a lesson, viewed the lesson, and completed the Post-Conference Teacher Reflection form. They reflect on their teaching in relation to the SC Teaching Standards and share their findings with their colleagues.
- Thirty-nine educators have licenses that will expire on June 30, 2025. Twenty-eight educators have already submitted documentation for license renewal. Eleven teachers are still completing recertification requirements, which include 120 renewal credits. Renewal credits can be accumulated through graduate courses, SCDE workshops, and professional development related to Student Learning Objectives.

Mrs. Rachel Traynham reported the following:

 - a. Planning for the Mobile Mammogram Unit is underway.
- 2. Mental Health
 - a. We will be meeting with ReGenesis Health to discuss a potential partnership with them.
 - b. We continue to serve a large population of students.
- 3. SPED
 - a. We are reviewing paperwork as a form of internal auditing.
 - b. We will have a Medicaid Audit on March 13th.
 - c. The County SPED Director meeting will be held in D5 on March 6, 2025
- 4. Federal Program Information/Compliance
 - a. Strategic Plan
 - i. Each school is working on their school plan at this time/needs assessment. The application from the state just opened recently.
 - ii. We will work to have the plan completed by the April 30th deadline set by the state.
 - b. OCR Report
 - i. I was able to submit the mandated OCR report last week.
 - c. Enrollment Questions
 - i. We will be adding the following questions to our enrollment survey for 25-26: -Are there court orders regarding custody?
 - -Does either parent have restrictions on contact (court documents or DSS kinship placement must be provided)?
 - d. Youth Art Month at the Chapman Cultural Center- March 17-May 2. We are the host district. The banquet is not yet set but once it is announced, I will email everyone.

Mrs. Jennifer Turner provided the following report:

- 1. On February 24th, all schools began the 2024-2025 after-school program. This program will end on April 2nd. Students receive additional standards-based instruction in a small group setting in Math, Language Arts, or both during this designated time.
- 2. Schools, along with district staff, continue to review testing procedures and guidelines for upcoming state mandated assessments. Upcoming webinars and workshops are scheduled as we prepare for SC Ready (which includes Science), EOCEP, and the WIN Career Readiness Assessment. *This year, SC Ready (grades 3-8) will include an additional testing day to accommodate the new English/Language Arts standards.
- 3. South Carolina will be implementing new math standards for the 2025-2026 school year. Select teachers from each school attended the Textbook Caravan, hosted by the South Carolina Department of Education, on February 27th. Schools will spend March 3- March 14 in school level meetings and making grade level selections. *From March 18-28, textbooks samples for all grade levels will be on display in the District Office conference room for Board Members to review. At the March 31st Board Meeting, the Board will be asked to approve new math materials as these will become instructional materials for the 2025-2026 school year.
- 4. Performance Task Assessments will conclude on March 7th.
- 5. The WIDA Access test for Multi-Lingual learners will conclude on March 7th.
- Woodruff Middle School will begin MAP testing on Monday, March 24th and conclude April 4th. Woodruff High School will MAP test Monday, March 10th- March 13th.
