

HOUSE BILL 250

On May 15, 2024, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine signed House Bill 250 into law, requiring all Ohio school districts to establish board policy governing student cell phone usage during school hours. Districts are mandated to adopt these policies by July 1, 2025.



What the Policy Means for Student?

OFF AND AWAY ALL-DAY

UNSTRUCTURED TIMES

RESTROOMS OR LOCKER ROOMS

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION

Cell phones must remain off and stored from arrival until dismissal Cell Phones must remain off and away during all school hours, including unstructured times like lunch and study halls

For privacy and safety reasons, cell phones are prohibited from restrooms and lockerooms

If a student needs to contact a parent or guardian, they should use the main office


ENFORCEMENT & ACCOUNTABILITY

1ST OFFENSE: STAFF
CONFISCATION OF THE DEVICE.
IT WILL BE RETURNED TO THE
STUDENT AT THE END OF THE DAY

2ND OFFENSE: STAFF
CONFISCATION OF THE DEVICE.

3RD OFFENSE: STAFF
CONFISCATION OF THE DEVICE.
THE DEVICE MUST BE PICKED UP BY
A PARENT AT THE SCHOOL AND
MEET WITH THE PRINCIPAL.

REPEATED OFFENSES:
PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE WILL BE ISSUED, WHICH MAY RESULT IN SUSPENSIONS.

WHAT DOES A "CELL PHONE-FREE SCHOOL" MEAN?

A cell phone-free school means that students are not allowed to use their phones or internet-connected devices during the school day, including in classrooms, hallways, restrooms, and common areas. Phones must be stored off and away in a locker or bookbag and may not be accessed until the end of the school day.

WHAT IF A STUDENT NEEDS THEIR PHONE FOR MEDICAL REASONS?

Accommodations will be made per the student's 504/IEP plans

HOW WILL PARENTS COMMUNICATE WITH STUDENTS DURING THE DAY?

Parents can call the main office for urgent messages

WHY IS THE SCHOOL IMPLEMENTING A CELL PHONE-FREE POLICY?

HB 250 requires schools to implement a policy restricting cell phone use during school hours. Research shows that excessive phone use in schools negatively impacts learning, focus, social interactions, and mental health. By reducing distractions, we aim to create a more engaging, focused, and positive school environment where students can fully participate in learning.

WHAT RESEARCH SUPPORTS LIMITING CELL PHONE USE IN SCHOOLS?

Studies from institutions like the American Psychological Association and the Pew Research Center indicate that cell phone use can contribute to increased anxiety, reduced attention span, and lower academic performance. Schools that have implemented phone-free policies have reported improvements in student behavior, engagement, and social interaction.

WHAT TYPES OF DEVICES ARE INCLUDED IN THE POLICY?

The policy applies to all personal electronic devices, including smartphones, smartwatches, tablets, earbuds, and other communication devices. Classroom technology such as Macbooks and schoolissued devices will still be used for instructional purposes.

WHAT HAPPENS IF A STUDENT IS CAUGHT USING THEIR PHONE DURING THE SCHOOL DAY?

If a student is caught using their phone, it will be confiscated and stored in the main office until the end of the school day. A parent may need to pick up the phone for repeated violations.

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES FOR REPEATED VIOLATIONS OF THE POLICY?

Consequences may escalate with repeated offenses, including detention, a parent conference, In-School Suspension, or Out-of-School Suspensions. The goal is to encourage responsible behavior, not to punish students.

HOW WILL TEACHERS AND STAFF ENFORCE THE POLICY FAIRLY AND CONSISTENTLY?

Staff will be trained on enforcement procedures to ensure consistency. Students will receive clear expectations at the start of implementation, and reminders will be provided as needed.

WHAT IF THERE IS AN EMERGENCY AT SCHOOL? HOW WILL STUDENTS BE INFORMED?

In the event of an emergency, school staff will communicate directly with students through the PA system, classroom announcements, and teacher instructions. Parents will be notified via school communication channels.

HOW WILL THIS POLICY IMPACT STUDENT SAFETY, ESPECIALLY BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL?

The policy applies only during school hours. Students are allowed to use their phones before and after school.

CAN PARENTS OPT THEIR CHILD OUT OF THE POLICY?

No. This policy applies to all students to ensure fairness and effectiveness. If a parent has concerns, they should contact the school administration to discuss possible accommodations.

ARE TEACHERS AND STAFF ALSO REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE CELL PHONE-FREE POLICY?

Staff are expected to model appropriate phone use and limit use during instructional time. However, they may need to use their phones for school-related communication.

HOW WILL THIS POLICY BE INTRODUCED AND COMMUNICATED TO STUDENTS, PARENTS, AND STAFF?

The policy will be communicated through school newsletters, student assemblies, classroom discussions, and parent meetings.

WHEN WILL THIS POLICY TAKE EFFECT?

Pending Board approval, this policy will be set to take effect after spring break, starting on Monday, April 28, 2025.

WHAT CAN PARENTS DO TO SUPPORT THIS INITIATIVE?

Parents can help by discussing the importance of staying present at school, reinforcing expectations, and ensuring students understand why the policy is in place.
