Alternate Diploma Advantages

Increased Post-Secondary Options

Students with a high school diploma are more readily accepted in vocational programs that can improve skills in a specific career.

Higher Employment Rates

Only 24% of adults without a high school are employed, including those with significant cognitive disabilities.

Alternate Pathway

The Alternate Pathway allows students to earn a high school diploma by completing a modified curriculum tailored to their individual needs.

Alternate Diploma

Eligibility

In order to be eligible to earn an alternate diploma, a student must have a significant cognitive disability and the IEP team must recommend that the student take the California Alternative Assessment (CAA) instead of the standard California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP).





Requirements

Students eligible to earn an alternate diploma must only meet the minimum California state high school graduation requirements:

3 years of English 1 year of VAPA, World Language, or CTE

2 years of mathematics 2 years of physical education

2 years of science *Ethnic Students & Personal Finance

3 years of social science








