| | "In the Spotlight" – Student Representatives Allen Park High School – Giselle Vivar, Lilly Acker and Joey Ramey gave updates from the high school which included class fundraisers, field trips, club events and upcoming drama club rehearsals. |
| | Special Presentation: Mid - Year Educational Goals Update by Dr. John Tafelski: Dr. John Tafelski presented his winter academic update that is based on NWEA testing. The NWEA results were discussed showing growth and progress including areas that stayed the same, exceeded last year's results or maybe fell a little short. The idea is to analyze these figures and determine where things need to change. Going forward, the focus remains on small group instruction and progress monitoring to help those students who may be struggling. |
| | Data dive meetings are taking place to see how many students are progressing enough to be exited from the MTSS program. Progress monitoring reports come out to parents three times a year for elementary and in fall and winter for the middle school. The math and reading coaches are really making a difference. |
| | We don't have coaches at MS and HS how is this going to be implemented in those buildings and when is it going to happen. Consulting with principals if we will be using this model on the secondary level. Starting by looking at the Academic Support classes at the HS Starting to have conversations about this. |
