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### High School Promotion Requirements:

- **Promotion to 10th Grade:**
  - **6 credits**
  - Individualized Graduation Plan updated
- **Promotion to 11th Grade:**
  - **13 credits**
- **Promotion to 12th Grade:**
  - **20 credits**
- **High School Graduation:**
  - **22 credits required** to earn a high school diploma

In North Carolina, high school students must meet specific graduation requirements set by the state. These requirements include completing a [certain number of credits across various subjects](#).

### Elementary School Promotion Requirements:

- **Attendance:**
  - No more than **18 absences**
- **Academic Proficiency:**
  - Must be proficient in core classes
- **Principal Discretion:**
  - Final promotion decisions may be based on the principal's judgment

[Required State Testing](#)- mCLASS Grades K-3: North Carolina's Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) selected mCLASS DIBELS<sup>®</sup> 8th Edition as the state's K-3 Literacy Assessment. mCLASS is an integrated literacy system based on the Science of Reading. mCLASS has been revised and upgraded from the assessment NC districts have used in the past, based on the latest research and the Science of Reading. It is a valid and reliable assessment, supporting universal literacy screening, screening for risk of dyslexia, and progress monitoring.

- 3x per year benchmarks

<p><b>What are the qualifications of my child's teachers?</b></p>	<p>Parents may look up your child's teacher licensure status at this website <a href="#">Link to the licensure website</a>.</p> <p>Please note that there may be a delay in the processing of some licenses through the Department of Public Instruction. Should you have questions, please reach out to the Human Resources Department at 336-246-7175. The licensure look up webpage does not include current employment information. Parents may need additional information (i.e., middle name or license number) to identify the teacher accurately. Substitute teachers (either short or long term) may not hold a NC teaching license. If a teacher is out on leave, a letter is sent home to explain the situation and replacement.</p>

<p><b>How can a parent help their child learn and make progress?</b></p>	<p>Engaging with your child about school and what they are learning is pivotal to their learning process.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Engage in daily conversations:</b> Ask your child about their day at school. Show interest in what they’re learning and the activities they participate in.</li> <li>• <b>Stay curious about their studies:</b> Ask specific questions about the subjects they’re studying and any assignments they have. This helps you stay informed and shows your child that their education matters to you.</li> <li>• <b>Connect with teachers:</b> Regularly check in with your child’s teachers to monitor their progress and understand how they are doing academically and socially.</li> <li>• <b>Offer support:</b> Ask teachers for ways you can assist your child’s learning at home, whether it’s reviewing concepts, practicing skills, or providing encouragement.</li> <li>• <b>Get involved:</b> Attend school events, from parent-teacher conferences to extracurricular activities, to stay connected with your child’s school community and find additional ways to support their success.</li> </ul>



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To help your child make progress in high school, consider these strategies:

- **Maintain open communication with teachers:** Regularly check in with your child's teachers. They can provide supplemental resources or strategies to reinforce learning at home.
- **Monitor grades consistently:** Stay up-to-date with your child's academic performance by checking their grades regularly. This will help you identify areas where they may need extra support.
- **Keep track of assignments:** Ensure your child is completing and submitting assignments on time. Encourage them to use a planner or digital tools to stay organized.
- **Promote tutoring and extra help:** Encourage your child to take advantage of tutoring or study sessions if they're struggling with certain subjects. Seeking help early can make a significant difference in their progress.
- **Create a structured homework routine:** Establish a regular time and quiet space for homework and studying each day. Consistency helps build good habits and minimizes distractions.
- **Encourage self-advocacy:** Teach your child to communicate with teachers directly when they need help or clarification. Developing self-advocacy skills is essential for success in high school and beyond.
- **Balance schoolwork with downtime:** Encourage a healthy balance between academics and relaxation to avoid burnout. Regular breaks and downtime are important for maintaining focus and well-being.
