


DRAMA CLUB PRODUCTION

The West Canada Valley Drama Club will be presenting the stage play CLUE on Friday, March 28 and Saturday, March 29 at 7 pm in the West Canada Valley High School auditorium. This hilarious murder/mystery is written by Sandy Rustin and based on a screenplay by Jonathan Lynn, as well as on the popular Hasbro board game CLUE. The plot of this intriguing mystery unfolds as key members of elite Washington DC society are invited to the Boddy mansion, presumably at the request of one Mr. Boddy (played by Dustin Shannon-Dineen), and greeted at the door by a his proper British butler, Wadsworth (Julius Grower), accompanied by French maid, Yvette (Charlotte Allen), and the ever-present and sinister Cook (Pongpudit Chirangwaraphoj). As the six guests arrive, they are informed they must use pseudonyms to protect their identities: sardonic Miss Scarlet (Olivia Ray), batty Mrs. Peacock (Mya Johnson), morbid Mrs. White (Olivia Broadbent), arrogant Professor Plum (Nathan Ruppert), anxious Mr. Green (Matthew Lape), and pompous Colonel Mustard (Glenn Broadbent). The plot thickens when they are given weapons with which to kill Wadsworth, who has presumably been blackmailing them -- but has he? And do they? What follows is hilarious and engaging "whodunit" that leads the audience through a devious maze of twists and turns, including the arrival of an unexpected motorist (William Muthig), as well as a dutiful, but sadly ill-fated police officer (Luke Dougherty). The entire show culminates with an intricate, fast paced final scene that has challenged each of these high school performers and is guaranteed to have the audience on the edge of their seats and roaring with laughter.

CLUE is directed by Patricia Lang and Joyce Patti and is a student driven production, featuring musical accompaniment by Lily Williams, who will be playing original music by Michael Holland. Additionally, complex sound effects will be provided by Paige Harodecki, lighting effects by Alexis Haynes-Davis, and the set features original artistic designs created by the West Canada Valley Art Club. As an added bonus, Art Club members, who have been working closely with their advisor, Ricci Sayers, will also have their art work on display both evenings in the high school library.

As we move towards the final months of the school year, the district enters into a very busy time. Budget development continues to move forward and we continue to gather further information in terms of anticipated revenue from both the state and federal level. In addition, students are progressing forward in their studies and the West Canada Valley Class of 2025 is entering the final stretch of their senior year. As we look ahead, commencement is scheduled for June 28, 2025. As we get closer, the district will communicate the details to everyone.

Budget Season

The district has devoted a great deal of time and effort building out the budget for the 2025-2026 school year. The governor's proposed budget has provided West Canada Valley with a 2% increase in foundation aid. Last year the district did not receive an increase in state aid so this is a step in the right direction. With much of our revenue dependent on state aid, the district will watch closely as future discussions occur at both the state and federal levels. The district will work to financially support the programs and ensure that students are given a high quality education while being responsible to the taxpayers. As always, the budget will be program-driven with great emphasis on curriculum options, mental health supports, extra-curricular options, and academic intervention needs of our students. We look forward to the coming months and to your continued support throughout this process.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Three Open Seats

Petitions are available in the District Office for candidates interested in running for a seat on the Board of Education. Qualified district residents will be electing **three (3)** members to the Board of Education on Tuesday, May 20, 2025. The following Board Members have terms that will expire on June 30, 2025: Mrs. Jessica Bartlett, Ms. Shauna Harrington, and Mr. Roger Kemler.

To qualify for membership on a school board an individual:

- Must be able to read and write
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before the election
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family
- May not be a current employee of the school
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office

Candidates must return their completed petitions, with a minimum of 25 qualified voter signatures, to the District Clerk no later than 5:00 pm on Monday, April 21, 2025.

2025-2026 UNIVERSAL PRE-K (UPK 5-HOUR PROGRAM) AND KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

To be eligible for enrollment in either Universal Pre-K (UPK 5-hour Program) or Kindergarten in September 2025, children must meet the following requirements:

- UPK 5-hour Program
 - Child must turn four (4) years old on or before December 1, 2025
 - Be committed to a school day from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm
 - Be transported to school by the parent/guardian by 8:15 am (afternoon transportation will be provided)
- Kindergarten
 - Child must turn five (5) years old on or before December 1, 2025.
- Residency
 - Be a West Canada Valley district resident

Universal Pre-K 5-hour Program All West Canada Valley students who turn four (4) years old on or before December 1, 2025 are eligible for the West Canada Valley CSD Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) in September 2025. The hours of instruction will be from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm with parents/guardians providing transportation to school by 8:15 am. The UPK Program students will be transported home on a designated UPK bus. To request a UPK registration packet, please call or email the district registrar (contact information below).

The Universal Pre-K 5-hour Program registration deadline is Friday, April 11, 2025. If we have more students registered than spaces available, a lottery system will then be used to select students. Children who are not chosen through the lottery will be placed on a waiting list. Selection is not based on the order in which students register. If you have specific questions about UPK, you may contact Christine Nofri, Elementary Principal, at 315-845-6800, ext. 1100.

Kindergarten registration: If your child is presently enrolled in the West Canada Valley UPK Program, registration is not required. If your child is not a current UPK student, or if your family has just moved to the district, please call or email the district registrar to request a Kindergarten registration packet be mailed to you.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to register both UPK 5-hour Program and new Kindergarten students, in person, during the dates and times listed below:






8TH GRADERS GO CROSS COUNTRY SKIING

School Sports:

If any student plans to participate in a school sport they must have an updated physical exam on file. It is best to have your child check with the Health Office prior to the start of all sports seasons to ensure that their physical exam has not expired.

Working Papers:

If any student will need working papers for employment an updated physical exam must be on file with the Health Office. If one is not on file working papers cannot be issued.

Physical Examinations:

New York State Law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time, and when entering Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade. Physicals are acceptable that have been performed no longer than 12 months prior to the first day of school in September.

Attendance:

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason please contact the Health Office.

Your information is not shared at school and is kept secure. If your income status has changed, or your student qualified for Free or Reduced meals in the past, please consider updating your status.

We will also offer A 'la Carte foods and snacks that can be purchased. Many families have set up accounts on the My School Bucks website (https://www.myschoolbucks.com). This helps eliminate students from carrying cash with them and keeps you in control of how much your student can spend at school for extra food.
