 The Karen Thomas Fund provides grants to teachers and other educators who seek funding for literacy-related projects


 The Karen Thomas Fund emphasizes projects targeting minorities, the economically disadvantaged and other at-risk groups.

History

- Established in 2009 in honor of Karen Thomas, writer and reading volunteer
- Originally administered by AAPS Educational Foundation
- Transferred to Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation in 2017
- Since inception, over \$116,000 in teacher grants
- Funded by private donations
- Recently received gifts from Comerica, Wacker Chemical Company
