# The Boycott Movement Against Israel

The Palestinian group Hamas led a surprise attack against Israel from the Gaza strip by land, air, and sea on October 7, 2023. Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions (BDS) is led by Palestinians for freedom, justice, and equality, which caused many to stop purchasing from companies such as Starbucks and McDonalds due to their ties to Israel. In vox.com's online article, "The boycott movement against Israel, explained," by Whizy Kim, around 84% of Americans were unaware of the decades-old campaign BDS until viewing the

Israeli military. Starbucks' labor union was sued after their social media account posted in support for Palestinians, causing some to begin boycotting their stores. The renewed attention on BDS has caused organized demonstrations by local groups to begin taking place worldwide. One of the main criticisms of the BDS movement has been that it hurts Palestains through the reduction of economic opportunities. The Israeli government attempted to crack down on BDS efforts, passing a law banning people who support boycotts of the country from entering Israel in 2017.

Currently 38 U.S. states have passed some kind of anti-BDS law, while others blacklist companies supporting BDS from receiving government

a Congressional Research Service report, and the Biden administration recently proposed a \$106 billion foreign aid package that would include \$14 billion for Israel. Meanwhile, the White House has resisted urging a ceasefire." Many teenagers feel influenced by social media to support or cancel certain people or movements from influencers in fear of cancel culture. Cancel culture is when one takes a public stance against an individual or institution for their actions that are often considered offensive. Junior, Ayanna Campbell said, "I feel like it's a valid boycott but a lot of people are acting like they aren't drinking Starbucks but they are just providing more money to the company." Many people support causes such as the boycott online out of fear of what the public will think of them but don't actually care for the cause. Junior, David Lynch said, "I think I'm in the middle because I wouldn't boycott these places, but some people do... but I'm not judging them; I'm just not giving up these places." With so many

companies being boycotted many people such as Lynch feel like it's hard to stop buying from all of them since it involves companies he purchases from on a day to day basis. Along with this Lynch said, "A lot of people are just following TikTok," with the platform's influencers in support of the boycott against Israel along with pressuring people to do filters that support Palestine. With so many companies such as Starbucks being in the public eye due to their support of Israel, they use coupons in order to gain customers. Although social media has incredibly influenced the boycott against Israel, it has also created deep-seated negativity toward the movement due to pressure to follow social media's opinion. As of January 31st the boycott is still going with no end in sight, with many believing a cease fire is more important.

## Fast Food Workers In California Minimum Wage Rising

As of September 28, 2023, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed a bill raising fast food workers' wages to a minimum of \$20-per-hour that goes into effect on April 1st of this year. This decision has sparked a significant amount of debate and discussion amongst California residents ever since. Those in favor of this bill argue that this wage increase will be a great help in overcoming wage inequality and improving workers' overall standard of living, while others against the decision express concerns over how it may have a potentially negative impact on small businesses and the economy as a whole.

The state of California, notorious

for its high living costs, has been leading the fight for fair wages in recent years. The governor's decision to raise the minimum wage has come as the result of a series



of demonstrations and workers' advocacy campaigns that discuss the difficulties those in the service industry face at their jobs. Advocates of workers' rights say in these campaigns that this will aid workers by allowing them to more easily cover basic living expenses and increase their participation in the economy.

Other proponents speak of the additional potential benefits the decision can have. By giving fast food workers more purchasing power, they argue that it will stimulate local economies and ultimately benefit everyone involved. They also say that increased wages could possibly reduce workers' reliance on government welfare programs, as they would be able to pay for their own living costs.

However, this bill still has critics with their own thoughts on the matter. They say the decision will hurt smaller, mom-and-pop style businesses as it would greatly increase labor costs, which were already difficult for them to cover in the midst of inflation. They also say they worry about the bill potentially worsening inflation and causing even more harm despite its

good intentions. The wage increase approval in California is just one example of a developing trend in the United States of states raising the minimum wage. Other examples include New York and Hawaii. As the debate continues, the bill waits to come into effect and its outcome is yet to be determined. Regardless of whether its potential benefits or detrimental effects come to pass, this development is a milestone in the struggle of industry workers for fair wages and treatment. It also displays a growing consciousness within the nation about the future of wages and workers' rights.

## How Technology Has Destroyed Romance



Desensitization has also proven to cause irrational behavior online, particularly when conversing with one's partner, a situation wherein most do not consider the repercussions, demonstrating that technology has damaged growing generations' ability to think and reason.

The way in which adolescents interact and relate to their peers, as well as their cognitive

development, has been in a pattern of regression over the past two decades. Interpersonal environments allow adolescents to learn social cues such as countenance, body language, and tone of voice. Such interactions also allow adolescents to obtain more confidence in social settings and expand their communities. However, research suggests that an extensive amount of teens consider interacting with their friends or partners online as "hanging out," and find it a burden to make the effort of coordinating an in-person event (Lenhart et al. 2015). With this information, the question of why a couple would prefer to talk over the phone than be with each other in real time must be asked. Technology, particularly cell phones, has served as a crutch for social anxiety, but in reality has only worsened the crisis. With easy access to virtual communication always in the palm of one's hand, it has become a reasonable alternative to the now seemingly outdated social setting. What was once one of the most integral

events in a child's development is now an idea that is becoming something of the past, replaced by a practice inflicting more damage than good.



## Evolution of Romance Songs

From the romantic and melancholic sonnets of Shakespeare to the undying love in the lyricism of Al Bowlly and up to the affectionate songs of Vashti Bunyan, the subject of love in poetry and music has been pivotal throughout time despite the themes always shifting over the years. In the udiscover-music.com article "Deconstructing The Love Song: How And Why Love Songs Work" by Martin Chilton, the piece's author says, "For thousands of years, humans have put into music the most intense longings of their souls and the deepest regrets of their hearts[...] and the love song remains a core part of 21st-century lives."

Throughout the 20th and 21st centuries the subject of love has been ever-evolving, oftentimes leaving some claiming the change has taken away the deeper meaning in love songs, while those like Junior Maria Curriel Alaniz claiming that "love"



songs are now focused on pessimism, saying, "It's more normalized for the lyrics to be negative now."

Even across genres there can be a notable difference between, for example, pop or metal. One focus-

es more typically on attraction to their partner and the feelings they have for each other, as opposed to focusing on the betrayal felt by a partner or even heavier topics of abuse. While most genres explore all aspects of relationships, passion and heartbreak alike, there are recurring themes for each. As with genres, throughout decades music has slowly shifted its focus and expanded its talking points. Curriel expresses her thoughts on the difference, saying, "Older romance songs spoke about it in a more romantic, fairytale way, where now they make it more negative, like talking about abusive relationships." Similarly, there are points regarding how romance songs have become more impersonal as they progress.

A notable time-period is the 1940's, where many artists would speak about their undying admiration for their partner. Most typically it would be romantic ballads about seeking affection or loving someone regardless of being loved back. This can be seen in the way that a song by The Ink Spots entitled "I Don't Want to Set the World on Fire" became extremely popular following the bombing of Pearl Harbor. It speaks

of the singer's love for someone who doesn't love him back, encapsulating the sound and themes in the lyricism of the decade by singing, "I've lost all ambition, For worldly acclaim, I just want to be the one you love."

Following this came the 1950s and 60s where doo wop, oldies, and blues songs held much of the west tightly, often with themes of accepting harsh treatment so long as they are loved by their partner or wanting their partner despite being apart. The most explicit display of this would be the Elvis Presley song "Love Me," where he says, "Treat me mean and cruel [...], Wring my faithful heart, Tear it all apart, But love me." Among these songs are records such as "I'm Your Puppet" by the Latinaires, "There is Something on Your Mind" by Big Jay McNeely, and "Oh My Angel" by Bertha Tillman.

As Hollywood and popular culture became more sensationalized and obsessive from the 90s into the 2000s, it was common for many music artists to have songs, both negative and positive, about their partners who work in the same industry. A song which garnered many people's attention due to speculation of it being about a public relationship with Brittany Spears was Justin Timberlake's "Cry Me a River," in which he



describes his ex-girlfriend's infidelity, saying, "You don't have to say, What you did, I already know, I found out from him, Now there's just no chance, For you and me." On the opposite end of



the spectrum was Jeff Buckley's "Everybody Here Wants You," where he vividly describes the look of his partner with lilac skin and 29 pearls in her kiss in order to explain her "flame" in him.

In most recent years, the themes have returned to the apparent default of idolized love and loving someone despite not being noticed. One such instance is Labrinth's Euphoria track, "You Still Don't Know My Name," where he sings the following: "And I would die your slave, For you right now, But you still don't know my name." In the track he even compares the subject to a God and Nefertiti, the queen of Ancient Egypt's 18th Dynasty.

Each decade has consistent lyrical themes, but as time goes on and society goes through its natural changes the focus of the lyricism shifts, as does the sound.




## Is Romantic Comedy Dead
