

Brigadier (Ret'd) Peter Gilbert QVRM TD DL VR

Having joined the Territorial Army in 1976 and served in the Regular Army during the 1980s, Peter has lived in Medway since 1990 and combined being a GP in Rochester with parallel careers in the Army Reserve and later the RAF Reserve. He served in Germany, Iraq, the Falkland Islands (twice) and in Afghanistan, where he commanded the UK Hospital in Camp Bastion in 2009. He was Deputy Commander of 2 South East Brigade and became Deputy Director of Army Medical Services in which role he was also a Queen's Honorary Physician. He retired from active military service in 2023. He was appointed a Kent Deputy Lieutenant in 2010.
