Stonyhurst College is the UK's leading Catholic co-educational boarding and day school for pupils aged 3-18. Boarding is from the age of 7.

At the College, there are approximately 650 pupils aged 11-18, two thirds of whom are boarders. At Stonyhurst St Mary's Hall, the adjacent dedicated preparatory school, there are around 200 pupils aged 3-11. Stonyhurst is set in stunning countryside, near the Ribble and Hodder rivers and the beautiful Trough of Bowland. Manchester is only about an hour away by road or rail. The market town of Clitheroe is four miles away, and we are 12 miles from the city of Preston. The Lake District can be reached in about an hour, and the Yorkshire Dales are even closer.

Stonyhurst has a fascinating heritage, being the oldest continuously active Jesuit school in the world. It was founded in St Omer, Northern France (then the Spanish Netherlands), in 1593, and moved to its present site in Lancashire's beautiful Ribble Valley in 1794. Throughout the years of religious persecution in England, Stonyhurst educated the boys of the English Catholic aristocracy and gentry.

The College's Ignatian mission and identity, and its sense of family, set Stonyhurst apart from other schools. Pupils are urged to do as much as they can (Quant Je Puis) for other people following the example of Jesus Christ and following in the spirit and charism of the Jesuits .The College prepares young people to change the world for others.

Stonyhurst is a family where heritage and innovation are fused to inspire young people to be agents of change in the world.

THE Role

We are delighted to offer a fantastic development opportunity for highly motivated and enthusiastic recent graduates who are looking to experience work and life within an outstanding boarding school environment. You will gain invaluable experience in a busy boarding school. Whether or not you choose to pursue a career in education, you will leave Stonyhurst with many transferable skills to take with you into the future.

Our graduate positions provide opportunities to work in all areas of school life and across a variety of Sports and Activities. You will work within the pastoral, sports or Outdoor Education departments either supporting lessons, individuals or groups, help to plan and prepare lessons, and assist to create a positive atmosphere within the boarding houses where the pupils feel comfortable to relax and unwind.

Here at Stonyhurst, we aim to nurture independently-minded young people with the ability to stand up for their beliefs, preparing them intellectually, spiritually and emotionally for their lives beyond Stonyhurst. You have the opportunity to be a fundamental part of this. The Graduate Assistant will work alongside House Parents and Assistants, our talented body of staff and other recent graduates with similar skills and interests, allowing you to truly immerse yourself into life at Stonyhurst and become a part of the Stonyhurst Family.

The College operates over 200 activities of a co-curricular nature on a weekly basis in term times. Graduates are expected to support some of these based on specialisms and interests. As an example, these have included social football clubs for girls and boys, fencing, performing arts, chaplaincy and more.

This is an exciting role which requires a flexible approach to working. Your duties will vary, from assisting with the activities of your chosen discipline and other sports during the day, to supporting in the boarding houses in the evenings, breakfast duties with the pupils in the mornings to travelling to fixtures or events.







Key Responsibilities

- Lead and support Rugby teams across age groups 12-18 including in games sessions, training sessions and fixtures
- Work within the Sports department in the school, specifically in Rugby, supporting lessons and working with individuals and groups
- Enhance the learning experience of the pupils, helping them consolidate their understanding and express their thoughts and questions whilst developing your own skills at the same time
- Help to develop the pupils' talents by challenging them to give their very best in all that they do
- Support the staffing of weekend fixtures or events
- Support the department with administration and other tasks as directed by the Director of your department
- Work alongside the House Parent and Assistant and share responsibility for the pastoral care of a Boarding House and Playrooms
- Ensure the safeguarding and welfare of pupils is a priority at all times
- Organise and supervise study periods along with activities during the weekend
- Do your best to create and sustain a positive atmosphere where the pupils can relax and unwind whilst feeling comfortable and secure

This is a full-time position within a busy boarding school and duties are timetabled over six days, including evenings and weekends. Graduate Assistants are an integral part of our pastoral teams.





Boarding AT STONYHURST

Stonyhurst boarding is central to the role of a Graduate Assistant. At Stonyhurst we aim to provide a home away from home, with a lively, family atmosphere in a comfortable, informal and supportive environment.

Across the College, there are five boarding houses for boys and three boarding houses for girls. Each boarding house is run by a dedicated House Parent and Assistant, and a team of staff who support their work. Our House Parents live in the boarding house, and each house has its own unique, family atmosphere.

Stonyhurst is a 7-day-a-week boarding school, and boarders are grouped using a horizontal (year group) system, which allows the boarders to mix with pupils of the same age, learn and understand other pupil's cultures and faiths, and make life-long friends by living in a thriving community based on mutual respect.

Each year group has a dedicated 'playroom' for both boarders and day pupils. The playrooms are common areas, which comes from the emphasis on drama in a traditional Jesuit education, where pupils could practise a play to perform at the end of the year, provided it had a moral message.

Like all good schools we seek to build strong and caring communities, but in Jesuit schools we have a particular commitment to caring for the individual. We recognise that people are different and we want to accompany our young people as individuals, recognising their particular gifts, talents, strengths and weaknesses, and giving them hope for the future.

Jesuit schools are Catholic, and like Catholic schools throughout the world we share a commitment to helping parents bring up their children, encouraging reflection, prayer, religious commitment, and service to others. In this we are inspired by and faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We welcome those who are Catholic, from other Christian Churches, and those who belong to other faith or religious traditions or are of no religious tradition. Anyone who wishes to teach or learn at one of our schools must come with an open mind ready to appreciate and learn from the Christian message and that of other traditions.
