Efficient and Effective Operations

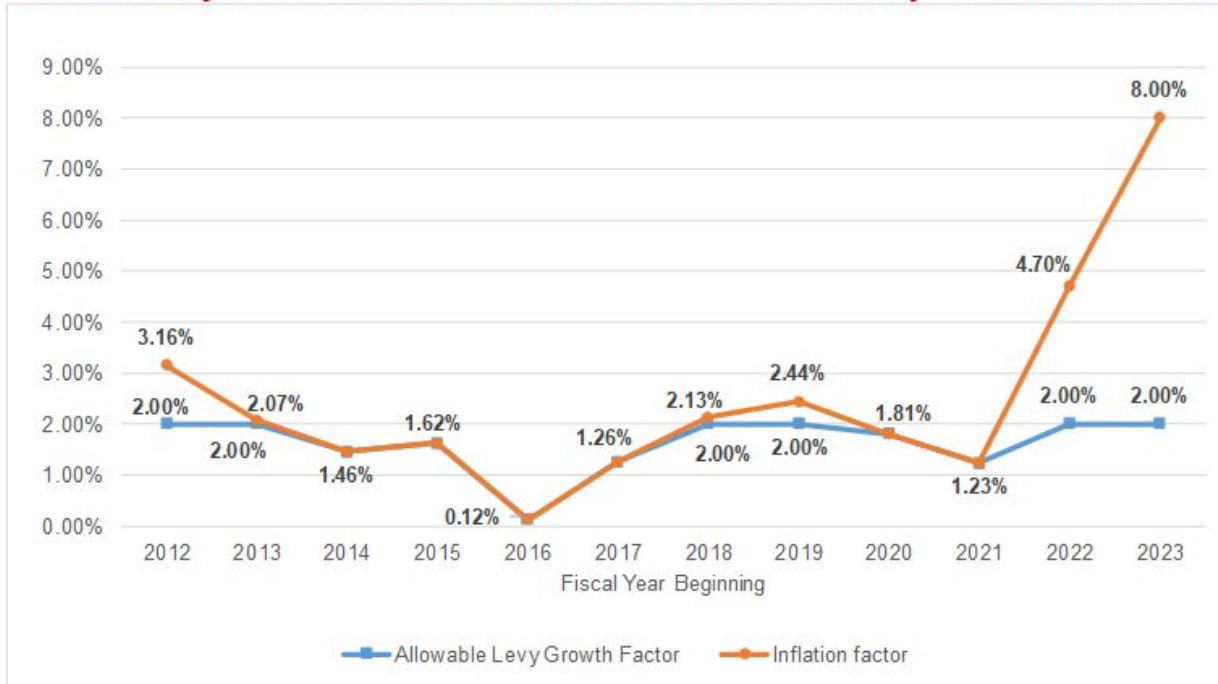
- Maintaining district-wide staff and programs

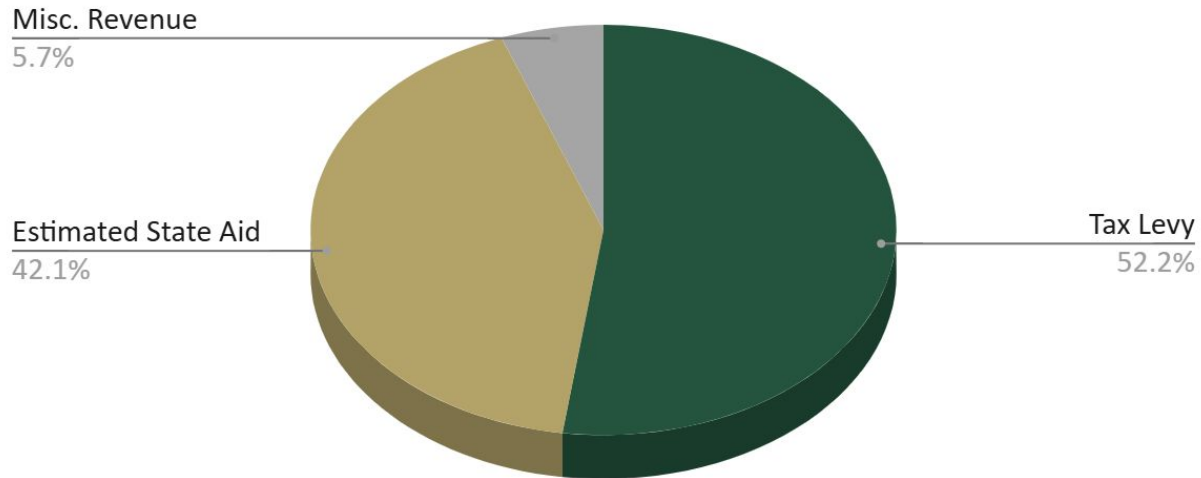

What Happens if the Budget Fails?

Total reductions needed for a contingent budget

\$ 4,927,042

What Happens if the Budget Fails?

Limited opportunities for students

Reduced services and programs for students and staff

Increased class size

Reduction of staff: Administrators, Teachers and CSEA

Adopt a contingent budget (required)

No increase in the current tax levy (a zero percent cap)

What Happens if the Budget Fails?

Eliminate all new equipment purchases

Reduce building repairs

Suspend capital projects

Limit use of buildings & grounds by community organizations

(impose fees required by law)
