# **Multi-sensory Word Building Board**

# **Project Description:**

The Countdown Student Kit is a multisensory learning tool designed to complement Countdown lessons. It engages students through auditory, visual, and tactile methods to enhance learning effectiveness. The kit includes a color-printed Countdown board, 26 black magnetic letter tiles, 5 red vowel magnetic tiles, 4 magnetic color tiles, two syllaboards, a half board, a dry-erase marker, and a mini eraser. These hands-on components help students develop foundational literacy skills in an interactive way, making learning more engaging and effective. Perfect for reinforcing phonics, spelling, and word-building activities in a structured and enjoyable format.

- The Countdown Student Kit aligns with the Waco Education Foundation's focus on creative classroom projects by providing an innovative, multisensory approach to literacy instruction. By integrating auditory, visual, and tactile learning methods, this kit enhances student engagement and supports diverse learning styles, fostering a more inclusive and effective classroom environment.
  - Additionally, this project supports the District and Campus Improvement Plans by addressing early literacy development—a critical foundation for academic success. Strong phonics instruction improves reading proficiency, a key goal in district-wide literacy initiatives. Equipping students with these hands-on learning tools will help accelerate skill mastery, ultimately leading to stronger student outcomes and increased literacy achievement across the school.
- 2. The goal of the Countdown Student Kit project is to enhance early literacy instruction by providing students with engaging, hands-on learning tools that reinforce foundational reading skills. Specifically, we aim to:
- Improve Phonemic Awareness & Phonics Skills Students will develop a stronger understanding of letter-sound relationships, blending, segmenting, and syllable patterns.
- Increase Student Engagement & Retention The multisensory approach will help students stay actively involved in their learning, leading to better retention of literacy concepts.
- Support Differentiated Instruction The kit allows for individualized and small-group instruction, meeting the diverse needs of all learners.
- Boost Reading Readiness & Confidence By mastering essential literacy skills, students will gain the confidence needed to become independent, proficient readers.
- Success will be measured through student participation, teacher observations, and improved phonics assessment scores, ensuring the kit effectively supports literacy growth.

- •Daily Phonics Lessons Teachers will incorporate the Countdown Student Kit into structured phonics instruction, allowing students to manipulate letter tiles, syllaboards, and color-coded components to build words and reinforce phonemic awareness.
- •Small-Group & Intervention Sessions The kit will be used in small-group settings to support students who need additional practice or intervention.
- •Interactive Literacy Centers Students will use the materials in literacy stations, promoting independent and peer-led learning.
- •Family Literacy Nights & Take-Home Kits Parents will be invited to participate in literacy workshops where they will learn how to support phonics development at home. Select kits may be available for check-out to encourage at-home practice.

# Objectives

- 1. Strengthen phonics and phonemic awareness skills through hands-on, interactive learning.
- 2. Increase student engagement and participation in literacy activities.
- 3. Support early reading success by providing resources that align with research-based instructional strategies.
- 4. Promote family and community involvement in literacy development through workshops and at-home practice opportunities.

- •Parents & Families Participate in literacy nights and use take-home kits to reinforce learning at home.

#### 4. Communication & Dissemination

We will actively involve the Waco Education Foundation in the implementation and success of the Countdown Student Kit project by:

- •Inviting Foundation Representatives We will extend an invitation for members of the Foundation to visit classrooms, observe the kits in action, and see firsthand how they are enhancing student learning.
- •Providing Photo & Media Opportunities We will capture photos and videos of students engaging with the kits and share them with the Foundation for promotional use.
- •Presenting at a Foundation Meeting We are willing to present an overview of the grant's impact, including student progress and teacher feedback, at a Foundation meeting.

To disseminate results across the district, we will:

- •Share Success Stories with WISD and District Newsletters Highlighting student growth and engagement through media outlets to showcase the grant's impact.
- •Host a Staff Development Session Teachers using the Countdown Student Kits will share best practices with other educators, ensuring the materials benefit a wider audience
- •Collaborate with Other Schools We will offer insights and implementation strategies to other schools in the district that may be interested in adopting similar multisensory literacy tools.

Through these efforts, we aim to amplify the impact of the grant, inspire further innovation in literacy instruction, and strengthen community partnerships in education.

#### 5. Evaluation

The success of the Countdown Student Kit project will be measured through a combination of student performance data, teacher observations, and engagement levels.

Key Evaluation Methods:

- •Pre- and Post-Assessments Students' phonemic awareness and phonics skills will be assessed at the beginning and end of the school year to measure growth.
- •Teacher Feedback & Observations Educators will document student engagement and progress in small-group and whole-class activities.
- •Student Work Samples Collection of student work (e.g., word-building activities, syllaboard exercises) to track skill development.
- •Parent Feedback Surveys and discussions during literacy nights will gauge family involvement and at-home learning impact.

By analyzing these data points, we will determine the effectiveness of the kits in strengthening early literacy skills and improving student confidence in reading.

6. Long-Term Implications & Sustainability

To ensure ongoing impact beyond the 2025-2026 school year, we plan to:

- •Incorporate Kits into Core Literacy Instruction Once purchased, these durable materials can be reused year after year, making them a lasting resource.
- •Create a Model for Future Implementation If successful, we will seek additional funding or district support to expand the use of these kits in more classrooms.
- •Professional Development & Teacher Collaboration Educators will share strategies and best practices through staff development sessions, ensuring continued effective use of the kits.
- •Community & Parental Engagement Continued involvement through literacy nights and at-home practice kits will reinforce learning beyond the classroom.

Through these efforts, the Countdown Student Kits will serve as a long-term, sustainable tool for literacy development, benefiting current and future students by building a strong foundation in reading.
