Exciting developments are underway at Ann Sobrato High School, where the FarmTECH District Farm is taking shape.

Spanning 20 acres, this innovative farm will feature both a 2+ acre demonstration farm and a 17+ acre production farm, offering hands-on learning opportunities and fresh, locally grown produce for our schools.



The demonstration farm will provide an immersive agricultural experience for students of all ages. Partnering with FFA and school groups, the farm will include learning stations with seasonal agriculture insights, solar and wind energy demonstrations, and the latest in farming technology. Students will engage with row crops, a greenhouse, orchards, a nursery, a vineyard, raised garden beds, and even bee hives, fostering a deeper connection to sustainable food production.

The production farm will have an even greater impact, growing seasonal produce to supply salad bars and meals across all schools in the district, and promoting fresh, farm-to-school nutrition. Funded in part by a Track 1 Incubator Grant from the California Department of Food and Agriculture, this project is a testament to our commitment to sustainability, education, and healthy school meals.

BRITTON MIDDLE SCHOOL'S STUDENT UNION RECOGNIZED FOR EXCELLENCE

Britton Middle School's Student Union has been honored by the <u>Coalition for Adequate School Housing</u> (CASH) for its outstanding design and positive impact on students.

Created by LPA Design Studios, the Student Union is a modern, all-electric space designed for collaboration and learning. Its open, two-story layout connects indoor and outdoor areas, creating a welcoming space for students. The building features a café that encourages interaction, a second-floor media center for group activities, and large windows that bring in natural light and fresh air. Located near downtown Morgan Hill, it also strengthens the school's connection to the community.

This award highlights our commitment to providing students with inspiring spaces to learn and grow.



PARADISE VALLEY STUDENTS SUPPORT HEART HEALTH AWARENESS


