





Tiger Family,

Junior/Senior Prom

Please join us for a night in Vintage Hollywood for this year's prom! Prom will be held on April 17th from 7 PM -11 PM at the Peanut Warehouse in downtown Conway! To buy tickets, please go to MyPaymentsPlus. All tickets will be sold through MyPaymentsPlus! To attend prom, all previous school fees MUST be paid! Tickets are live currently on the website and are \$45 in February, \$50 in March, and \$55 in April.

You can purchase a maximum of two tickets, one for you and one for your guest. If your guest does NOT go to CHS, they will need a form filled out that will be sent out soon and a copy of their I.D. You MUST be present with your guest, for them to be admitted into prom.

Students who attend prom **must** attend school for two instructional blocks on April 17. To accommodate students, we will hold advisory at the end of second block from 11:15 a.m. to 11:35 a.m. With this change in the schedule, students who are attending prom will be allowed to leave at 11:15 a.m. If students opt to leave at 11:15 a.m., 3rd and 4th blocks will be unexcused without proper documentation per our attendance policy. Earning Credit in Courses

- In order to receive credit for a semester course, a student cannot be absent for more than five unexcused or unverified days.
- In order to receive credit for a year-long course, a student cannot be absent for more than ten unexcused or unverified days. Students can complete attendance recovery to recover missed days.

Early Dismissals

- In order to expedite the early dismissal process, students must submit parent notes to the attendance office by 10 a.m. to be verified for early dismissal.
- If parent notes are not received by 10 a.m., the parent will have to report to the building for student dismissal.
- Once verified, students will receive an early dismissal slip from the attendance office so that they may leave at the scheduled dismissal time without class interruption.
- CHS will not allow parents to call into the attendance office or email the attendance clerks to release their student except in emergencies. If it is an emergency, the parent will be required to speak with the grade-level administrator for approval.



Parents should not plan for their child to be absent for three or more consecutive days of school without a medical excuse. There are no principal approved absences.



Lawful absences are considered medical, judicial, and bereavement. Documentation will need to be provided within three school days after the student returns for these absences to be lawful.



School disciplinary consequences will occur for any student who is tardy or leaves school without permission



Administration cannot complete the required paperwork for obtaining a driver's license unless the student is in compliance with the SC Truancy Law.



Parents and students have access to attendance through PowerSchool. This is a helpful tool to keep up with grades, attendance and discipline.

Attendance Recovery Information

Attendance make-up school is offered each semester for students who need to make up absences for credit purposes.

- Students can recover attendance by participating in Tiger Extension Tutoring
 receipts.
 - Students can attend Tiger Extension Tutoring on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:30-4:30 in the Media Center.
 - Students can earn one hour each day at Tiger Extension.
- Students can earn four hours by attending a session of Saturday school.
- Absences from the first semester must be recovered by March 22, 2025.
- Absences from the second semester must be recovered by June 2, 2025.

Please discuss the importance of school safety with your students. The guidelines below should be adhered to at all times.

- All visitors must report to the main office.
- Students are not to open exterior doors for visitors.
- Students should never prop open an exterior door with objects or intentionally leave an exterior door ajar. Exterior doors should be pulled closed and locked at all times, except during transition.
- All safety drills are to be taken seriously. Students should conduct themselves in an orderly fashion and take direction from staff members.
- Along with the district, we have adopted the "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol. The standard response protocol utilizes clear common language for emergency situations.
