- Student Transit will only pick up and drop off at daycare centers that are located within the boundary of the elementary school your child will attend for summer programming.
- Students attend summer programming at the school they attend during the school year.

- Students who reside in the walk boundary are not eligible for busing.
- There is no busing or programming the week of June 30 – July 4.

- Busing from home is available to students who qualify for busing during the school year.
- Students must register before noon on March 28 (busing registration deadline) to secure busing. Busing registration will be in Skyward.
- Students can only be bused to the building within their school path and entering in the Fall. (**There is an exception for South students who are eligible to be bused to Memorial due to construction**)
- Students who live within the walk boundary are not eligible for busing.
- There is no busing for athletic programs.
- There is no busing for any music lessons.
- There is no busing or programming the week of June 30 – July 4.




