


### Based on the specific needs of each campus, funds would address:

- gym renovations (and reconstruction where needed to ensure all high schools have at least one 94' competition-sized gym in alignment with UIL standards)
- new sound systems, digital video
   boards and interior lighting upgrades
- renovations and improvements to locker rooms, weight rooms, storage spaces and athletics offices

#### **EXTERIOR**

## Based on the specific needs of each campus, funds would address:

- conversion of baseball and softball fields to synthetic turf (including batting cages, dugouts, fencing, netting and pole systems)
- conversion of synthetic turf of one practice field to allow access to two synthetic turf fields per campus
- replacement or upgrades to stands, press boxes, support buildings, concessions, and restrooms
- additional tennis courts where need so each campus has eight tennis courts
- new LED sports lighting, scoreboards,sound systems and digital video boards

















At the 59-year-old Tully Stadium, the facility would downsize from 14,500 to 10,000 seating and provide:

- new home and visitor side stadium buildings, including new restrooms and concessions
- upgraded sports lighting and audio/visual systems and a new digital video board
- a designated band plaza and access ramps for band, drill teams and cheerleaders
- a new elevator tower, a new press box, and a central ticketing checkpoint for home and visitor sides



At the 51-year-old Don **Coleman Coliseum** (DCC) improvements would be made to address safety and security with new secure entry vestibules, new concession and restroom upgrades, replacement of the roof, and additional meeting space.




\*PROPOSED LOCATION





## Built in 1952 and the district oldest athletics facility, Reggie Grob Stadium, would receive major renovations and rebuilding.

- The 73-year-old stadium currently accommodates 4,000 spectators. **Improvements would increase seating capacity to 5,500,** thereby expanding the types of sporting events and competitions, including varsity football, that could occur at the facility.
- Grob is currently used for middle school football and soccer, as well as high school club lacrosse. The facility is also used by community and our community partners.




















# Debt Service funds and Operational funds are separate.



## **Debt Service Fund (Bond)**

- Recapture-proof
- 100% of funds remain in SBISD
- Fund capital improvements
- Cannot fund district operations
- Locally controlled
- 2024 Tax Rate: \$0.3045

### **General Fund**

- Dictated by the Legislature
- Subject to recapture
- Support SBISD's daily operations
- Tax Rate: \$0.7719



### THERE MAY BE A TAX RATE INCREASE.

## \$.0475 cents per \$100 of valuation

Assuming **all propositions pass**, the maximum anticipated tax rate increase would be .0475 cents per \$100 of valuation, based on a conservative cost estimate of taxable property value growth and current state law as of 1.1.25. For a \$500,000 home, the estimated annual additional tax burden would be \$142.50. **A property owner's tax burden (total tax paid) may change based on the appraised value of their property.** 

• SBISD's total tax rate for the 2024 tax year, is \$1.0764 per \$100 of assessed valuation (\$0.7719 M&O +\$0.3045 I&S) and represents the **lowest district tax rate since 1987** .



## Tax Rate Implications

SBISD has **one of the lowest tax rates** in the areas. We also offer the **full 20% Homestead Exemption**.

The estimated additional annual tax burden for a \$650M Capital Improvement Plan (example) on a \$500,000 home is approximately \$142.50.

# **FORMULA \$500,000** × .8=\$400,000 - \$100,000 = \$300,000 (divided by 100) X 0.0475 = **\$142.50**

## Over 65 or Disabled Homestead Exemption Reminder

### **REMINDER:**

By state law, the amount of school taxes paid (Tax Burden) is frozen for citizens who have the over 65 or disabled homestead exemption.

Approval of this bond <u>WOULD NOT</u> increase the amount paid above the frozen amount.

# Do I need an ID to vote?

votetexas.gov

## If you possess one of the following forms Yes. of acceptable photo ID, you must present it when voting in person:\*

- Texas Driver License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas Handgun License issued by DPS containing your photograph
- United States Citizenship Certificate
- United States Military Identification Card containing your photograph
- United States Passport (book or card)

\*With the exception of the U.S. Citizenship Certificate, for voters aged 18-69, the acceptable form of photo identification must be current or have expired no more than 4 years before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place. A person 70 years of age or older may use a form of acceptable photo identification that has expired if the identification is otherwise valid.
