4.4.1 Operational Interpretation:

Graduating students have the knowledge and skills necessary for college or career readiness.

I interpret this *policy wording* to mean:

1. Northview teaches the Michigan Career Development Model ([MI CDM](#)).
2. Northview High School actively engages students in credit retainment.
3. Northview provides work co-op opportunities for all students.

Data:

- 100% of 7th grade and 11th grade students have a current Educational Development Plan (EDP). EDPs incorporate the educational standards as identified in the Michigan Career Development Model.
- In addition to the state mandated EDP, Northview High School uses an in-house developed curriculum named MiGPS. The MiGPS curriculum emphasizes four behavior traits: **Communication, Collaboration, Productivity** and **Attendance**.
- ***MiGPS: Technology Platforms and Highlighted Data:***
- **Naviance** - Naviance is a college and career readiness platform we use to assign MiGPS tasks, deploy career assessments, college and career exploration, send transcripts and collect student college and career data to support the goal of developing all Northview students into lifelong learners. Naviance improved their Careers and Assessment experience in the spring of 2021 by adding a work-based learning tool, and an alumni tracker feature that is linked to the National Student Clearinghouse.
Examples of student engagement and data collection through Naviance:
 1. Current Northview students have engaged with the Naviance platform for task completion, college and career assessments, exploration, and college transcript requests. The cumulative total of all engagements is 6985.
 2. Percentage of seniors requesting a transcript to be sent to at least one college between 2014-2019 was 83%. Percentage of seniors requesting a transcript between 2020-2021 was 65.8%. This is consistent with the national trend of a decrease in post-secondary enrollment immediately after graduation.
- **Credit Retainment** - In order to increase the number of students that move to the next grade level with all of their MMC graduation requirements, the credit retainment model

used in AP Seminar courses during the 19-20 school year, is being deployed during the 20-21 school year. Students who engage in the Credit Retainment processes are given the opportunity, with assistance from content level teachers, to regain units in English and math courses that were failed in the previous quarters. At this point, 9 students have retained a total of 4.5 credits in English courses, moving from F to a credit-bearing grade for 1st or 2nd quarter courses. Additionally, there are currently 44 students that are actively attempting to recover a total of 22.0 credits (moving from F to a credit-bearing grade) in two different first-semester math courses - Algebra 1 and Geometry.

- **Work-Based Learning -**

2019-20 - 103 unique student enrollments with 75 unique employers

2020-21 - 58 unique student enrollments and 46 unique employers

2021-22 - 144 unique enrollments and 82 unique employers

Conclusion Statement:

The organization met expectations.

4.4.2 Operational Interpretation:

Graduating students succeed academically at post-secondary institutions.

I interpret this *policy wording* to mean:

1. Northview High School students are enrolled in Advanced Placement Seminar courses, regardless of their past academic success. This is critical in meeting the Board's ENDS of Literate, Creative and Problem Solver.
2. National Student Clearinghouse: Benchmark Data

Data:

- **Pre-AP Biology, Chemistry, Algebra 1, Geometry with Statistics** were the courses added for the 21-22 school year. As with the Pre-AP English 9 course (added 2019-20), these core foundational courses prepare students for future AP and regular grade level curriculum courses. Here are some highlights for each course:

- a. **Pre-AP Algebra 1** - Students will master linear relationships and craft arguments to solve real world problems.

- b. **Pre-AP Geometry and Statistics** - Students focus on concepts of measurement in the contexts of shape, space, and data.
- c. **Pre-AP Biology** - Students apply science practices to understand biological systems.
- d. **Pre-AP Chemistry** - Students apply science practices to understand matter and energy.
- [National Student Clearinghouse](#): Benchmark Data through the National Student Clearinghouse, a source for post-secondary enrollment and degree completion data.
 - a. 52% of 2020 Northview graduates enrolled immediately in a 2 or 4 year institution of higher education. Down from the previous average of 57% specific to the graduating classes from 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.
 - b. Currently no data available for 2020 graduates who remained enrolled in a 2-year or 4-year postsecondary institution from their first year to the second year. 49% of Northview graduates enrolled in a 2 or 4 institution of higher education returned for a second year specific to the graduating classes from 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Conclusion Statement: The organization continues the work of establishing benchmark data by which to gauge future growth.

4.4.3 Operational Interpretation:

Graduating students have the ability to access resources that further lifelong learning.

I interpret this *policy wording* to mean:

Northview students have been taught how to complete government forms, job applications, post-secondary applications, etc.

Students who qualify for the Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) are automatically notified and certified of their qualification by the Michigan Department of Treasury. In addition to the communications from the state, high school counselors connect TIP eligible students to the TIP program through large, small, and individual meetings and communications. Students who qualify must complete the FAFSA and choose the institution they plan to attend as their first choice in their FAFSA in order to receive TIP. There are currently 153 TIP eligible students at Northview High School.

Conclusion Statement: The organization met expectations.
