Brainstorming – Our Vision for The Future

On March 3, 2025, Watchung Borough School District administrators, Board of Education members, staff, students, parents, and community members, thirty-three in all, came together to for our second strategic planning meeting. Patti Rees from the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA) was present, and Dr. Glazer and Patti Rees reviewed the strategic planning process for the group.

We then gathered in six groups to brainstorm our unbounded visions for Watchung Borough School District over the next 5 years. Each group was asked to think about what our school district's future looks like in 2030, where everyone is succeeding and there are no barriers.

Groups were asked to title an article about the Watchung Borough School District in 2030 and identify 5-8 key visions of the district in the future, in addition to the current programs that are in place.
