This week, Explorer Academy students have been led by Michael Bloom and the Hip-Hop & Hope program as they spent time in their music and language arts classes. The students learned about the history of hip-hop and developed skills needed to be a DJ and rapper. The week-long program culminates on Friday as the students will have the opportunity to write their own raps and perform them for a small audience.

This unique opportunity encourages students to combine their writing skills with a music genre that they enjoy. It also requires students to step outside of their comfort zone and perform a rap of their own creation. Students learned about expressing themselves through their writing and demonstrating the social-emotional skills they have been practicing all year. Explorer Academy will be recording each student's demo rap and sharing it at a larger school assembly later in the year.
