







Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Dayton Grade School is focused on improving academic growth and attendance. Our attendance support for students includes personal phone calls, letters, meetings, and specific plans to ensure students are excited and prepared to be at school each day. In literacy, we provide opportunities to read and respond to challenging text, in class and at home leveled reading options. We ensure all students who are not reading at grade level are receiving targeted reading intervention. For math, our teachers have targeted specific learning goals to teach within each lesson and unit that will build upon each other as students progress through the grades.







BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Promoting the safety and well-being of all students is a top priority. Taking the time to get to know each and every student is important and is the foundation for creating a safe environment free from bullving and harassment. School counselors and staff use a variety of social-emotional programs such as PAX. RULER from Yale, and Harmony that are designed to build socialemotional health, reduce bullying, and achieve better peer relations among students. Any report of hazing, harassment, intimidation or bullying, and acts of cyberbullying will be forwarded to the school principal, or designee, who will gather information and conduct a prompt investigation. We have added a space for students to go to when they need to reset called the WIN Room (What I Need).

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Dayton Grade School has some afterschool opportunities. We permit community vouth sports teams and clubs the use our facilities at no charge for nonprofit activities that benefit our kids. We also purchase online licenses for various academic programs (RAZ Kids Reading) to provide all students with options to extend their learning at home.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We want to congratulate you since as a parent, you are your child's first teacher. You send us amazing, creative, energetic children and we are excited to see them each day. We invite you to join us in your child's education in 3 main ways: great attendance, encourage reading, becoming involved at school. You can get involved by volunteering in your child's classroom, joining Site Council, attending evening events like Open House, Family nights, and conferences, and by attending P.T.S.O. meetings.
