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How To Make A Club

Steps To Start A Club

Step 1: Brainstorm

- Come up with a unique concept to add to Sobrato's club scene
- Gather interest for your board members and ask a teacher to be your club advisor
- Prepare your club's constitution, complete with your club's purpose
- Brainstorm meeting activities

Step 2: Approval

- Submit your club constitution on the Club Google Classroom
- ASB will approve your club according to the ASB club guidelines
- Once your club is approved, a notice from ASB will be sent out

Step 3: Club Rush

- Make a poster/signage to promote your club
- Participate in club rush and find general members to join your club!

State Club Requirements:

According to the state of California, clubs must have the following:

- Must have a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer
 - 12 members (official active members)
 - Must hold monthly meetings
 - Must manage club funds appropriately and be audited periodically in accordance with the state.
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Sobrato Club Requirements:

- Follow of the State of California requirements
- Have a club constitution
- Must fill out club application form (located in club Google Classroom)
- Have a full board (president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer)
- Must participate in Club Rush


Failure to abide by these rules will result in first a notice, then an email, then full disbandment


