CAMPUS REMINDERS

As a safety precaution, students are not allowed to receive food deliveries from any restaurant or food delivery service such as Uber Eats, GrubHub or DoorDash. Any delivery person is considered a stranger to your child and should not be allowed to communicate with a minor. Students are allowed to bring lunch for themselves or have lunch brought to them by anyone on their pick up list (Parent, Sibling, Grandparent, guardian). If you would like to bring lunch for your child, it must only be one meal for them only. Bringing a whole pizza for their friends or several items of food for a group is not permitted. We do have students with food allergies that can be affected and it would be best to not run that risk.

Food deliveries made in violation of the above policy will be held until the end of the day at which point the student can come in after the release bell and pick-up their delivery. If they do not come in, the food will be thrown away.
