

Early Years Program



Expansion of EYP literacy programming to increase student growth through:

- Staff professional learning on early literacy (fall 2024)
- Reading partnership with elementary school peer readers
- Reading Assist tutoring program (pilot in summer 2024 w/25 students; expansion to 105 students in summer 2025)

This aligns with Red Clay's focus on early literacy and expands programming from early elementary into our preschool classrooms.

System of Support and Intervention



Programmatic focus on integration of Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS) for Academic & Behavioral support.

- Launch of the district-wide MTSS Framework (summer 2024)
- Increased use of social/emotional screening tool to provide targeted intervention - increase of 22% from fall 22 to 24



System of Support and Intervention



Expansion of programming focused on restorative practices, trauma and mental health.

- Receipt of Department of Justice grant on Restorative Practices (\$1 million) to support all schools in the implementation of Restorative Practices over three school years (November 2024)
- Adoption of the It's Not Ok program to address personal body safety and child sexual abuse required by Erin's Law (winter 24-25 SY)
- Implementation of the Erika's Lighthouse program to support mental health aligned with House Bill 301 requirements (program launch 3rd Marking Period)

- In its inaugural year, each school invited 50 students to these programs. Now in year two, these numbers have increased to 62 for AIHS and 74 for McKean.




Communications - Choice Law

Invitations not accepted by that date will be considered "refused."




