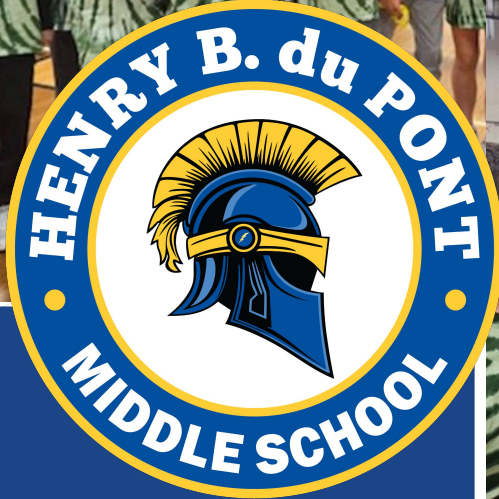

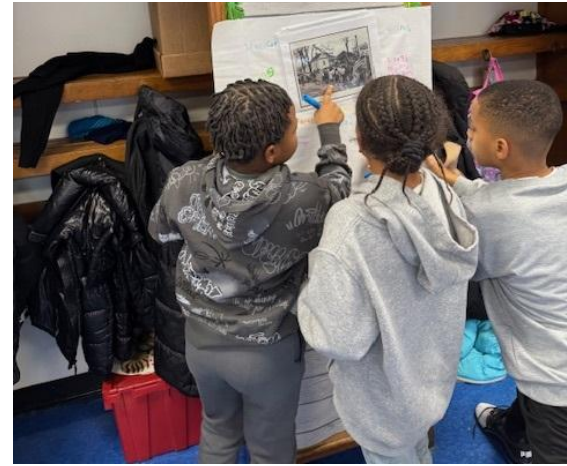
Secondary Literacy Leadership Academy



- On February 24th, Red Clay welcomed educators from neighboring districts and charter schools for the third cohort of SELLA in partnership with DOE.
- This professional learning opportunity connected the "science of reading" with best practices for interdisciplinary instruction while addressing the unique operational demands of secondary schools.
- Our Red Clay team engaged in meaningful discussions to build a shared understanding of the critical role literacy plays in student success.
- The goal is to build a common understanding of the meaning of literacy for all students, by all educators.

Empowering Young Delawareans

- Red Clay students are actively engaged in analyzing primary sources, fostering critical thinking and historical inquiry, thanks to funding from a Library of Congress grant.
- Educators from Johnson, Warner, Lewis, and Shortlidge participated in three professional learning sessions that focused on enhancing social studies instruction.
- This project is engaging teachers of K-3 students in professional learning to strengthen utilizing primary sources from the Library of Congress and the Delaware Historical Society.



Preparing Our Graduates for Future Workforce Opportunities

- Increase the percentage of graduates earning Work -Based Learning credit.
 - Increase the number of graduates earning Coop Credits.
 - Increase the number of completers of Career & Technical Education Pathways.
 - Increase the number of graduates earning an industry standard credential.
- Two middle schools (AIMS and Stanton) involved in year 2 of the pilot project for the statewide community of practice. This work better aligns our middle school student experiences with our high school programming options.
 - Both schools are leveraging the Related Arts classes to include career exploration lessons, experiences, and work-based learning opportunities.
 - We are increasing alignment across our 4 traditional middle schools in terms of master scheduling priorities, middle school CTE & Related Arts offerings, instructional minutes, and offering certification training for students.

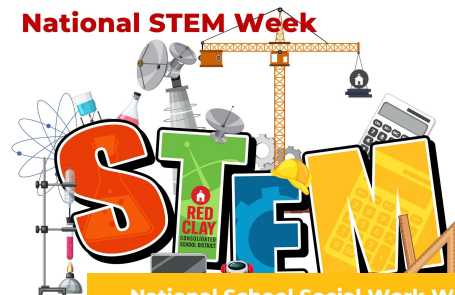

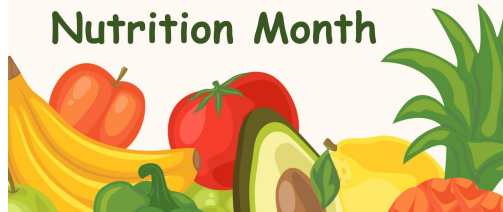
