



THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 30, 2025

From Fr. Eric:

The father's merciful reaction (Luke 15:20)



The First Reading tells the story of Israel upon entering the land of Canaan, the Promised Land. The story is sited at Gilgal and serves as a transition in the lifestyle of the people. At Gilgal, they celebrated the Passover and the day after, they began to eat the produce of the land of Canaan. This day marked a new beginning for the people of Israel. From now on however, they would have to till the land and produce what to eat.

In a way, this transition marked the end of their desert wandering and being fed by God in an extraordinary way. In the entire history of Israel, particularly during their period

in the desert, food played an important role in their relationship with God. The absence of food was the cause of complaint on many occasions. The abundance of food was seen as a blessing from the Lord, but it was also the cause of their distancing themselves from God.

In many situations of life, we observe that affluence or the availability of food can cause us to be inward looking and selfish. The parable of Jesus in the Gospel Reading uses food as the vehicle of the narration. The time the younger son lived with his father, he lived in comfortable circumstances. He became selfish and did not see the good the father was doing to him by providing all his needs for him. The decision to request his part of his inheritance even before the death of his father was a wicked one. His resolution to separate himself from his father and the rest of his family shows that he had no consideration for his personal responsibility toward the family. He thought his inheritance would provide him with food for all his life. He did not realize that he was not experienced in managing wealth properly.

The parable makes it clear the young man came to his senses only because he lacked food. When he was living an affluent life, he did not have time to reflect on his life. In his want, he realized that his previous life with his father was a glorious one. In his want, he also realized that his condition was worse than that of the servants in his father's house. Very often we do not realize our good conditions until we experience a worse situation than what we are used to. We'd expect the young man to reflect on his life and repent asking for his inheritance while his father was alive. Instead, he compared his life to his father's servants and seemed unaware of the gravity of his actions. However, his demand for pardon when he admitted his sins against his father and God, suggests a glimmer of remorse.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." The father's merciful reaction to his prodigal son's return, despite the son's squandering of his inheritance, illustrates God's love and forgiveness. This unexpected reaction of the father calls for rejoicing. This parable also challenges the judgmental attitude of scribes and Pharisees, emphasizing the importance of reaching out to sinners. As we learned from last Sunday's Gospel, God is always ready to offer us a second chance to repent and bear fruit. This week, we are making good use of the second chance given to us by reconciling with our merciful father.

Lent is a time for repentance and forgiveness, recognizing our imperfections and welcoming sinners back to God. We should extend forgiveness to others and rejoice in their salvation.

"Lord, I accept your offer of reconciliation!"
