We are looking for parents who are interested in leading PTA as an officer.


Attendance and Illness

Kindergarten Roundup


Kindergarten Roundup April 24

Since Grade 5 was unable to attend STARBASE this year, we got the opportunity to be visited by Billie Jones from STARBASE. She was able to conduct the Lieutenant Eggbert experiment with the students. The students had to decide what materials they would use to protect Lieutenant Eggbert for his moon landing. Several of the groups were successful, and Lieutenant Eggbert landed safely. It was a fun afternoon of learning for everyone.

In the classroom, Grade 5 is learning about geometry in math, and beginning a new module in reading exploring what role curiosity plays in exploration. We are beginning to plan our Grade 5 Honor Night. It's almost time for our students to move on to middle school!





As part of the Visible Learning journey at Salina Public Schools, our teachers are focused on being clear in their expectations and instruction to support student learning. Teachers use learning intentions and success criteria as a way to communicate and help your child understand:

- What am I learning today?
- · Why am I learning this?
- How will I know that I learned it?

Learning becomes more visible for students when there is a connection to what they are expected to learn (learning intentions) and what successful learning looks like (success criteria).

Celebrate learning with your child by asking what they learned this week and how they knew they learned it.

Teachers' use of learning intentions and success criteria combined with families talking about learning - **helps grow stronger learners**. Your conversations support Sunset's focus on developing students' resilience and perseverance by encouraging them to embrace challenges, learn from mistakes, and persist in their efforts to achieve their goals.

Kids and Exercise

When most adults think about exercise, they imagine working out in the gym, running on a treadmill, or lifting weights.

But for kids, exercise means playing and being physically active. Kids exercise when they have gym class at school, during recess, at dance class or soccer practice, while riding bikes, or when playing tag.
