Budget Review

Highlights:

- 1. Contractual salary and benefit increases
- 2. Official's rate increases (per conference agreement)
- 3. Increase in athletic trainer fees
- 4. Technology fees including online registration & scheduling platforms
- 5. Addition of new and emerging sports
 - a. 9th GVB: experienced meaningful growth in year 2, greatly expanded their competition schedule, numbers are strong
 - Girls Wrestling: also experienced growth in year 2, participation numbers grew and the competition schedule expanded and included a home dual match at Rec Hall
 - c. Girls Flag FB: evaluating as an emergent IM program as other school districts build their programs as well.

The State College Area School District Athletic Department has taken and continues to take steps to improve the overall budget operation process and to function in a fiscally responsible manner while providing, to the best of our ability, an expanding, engaging and quality interscholastic athletic experience for all participating student-athletes, our student body, staff, as well as our families.

To that end, the athletic department has:

- 1. explored opportunities for additional new revenue through advertisements and sponsorships. (Sponsorship revenue data and tracking)
- 2. continued collaboration with booster clubs in order to provide needs beyond budget.
- continued a transparent budgeting process in order to more effectively and efficiently purchase equipment and supplies for team needs.
- 4. continued to offer and support a variety of club and intramural opportunities

Areas in which the athletic department continues to monitor and evaluate:

- 1. inventory of equipment and supplies including organizing storage spaces
 - a. appreciative of new space in Physical Plant Building
- 2. evaluating the existing uniform rotation system for teams in order to efficiently calculate years when uniforms need to be replaced as well as monitoring and supporting equity
 - a. Uniform Rotation Schedule
 - b. What is Covered & Not Covered by SCASD
- 3. review of replacement needs for repurposing and expanding athletic spaces and venues (ie: equipment, goals, mats, nets...)
- 4. strategic decisions re: transportation options
 - a. combining teams on buses when possible
 - b. scheduling tri-meets / tournaments to reduce the number of out of town events
 - c. firm guidelines for modes of transportation
- 5. review and evaluate new and emergent sports opportunities (ie: girls flag fb, girls wrestling, MS baseball...)
- 6. adoption of 50+/- SC Lions athletes: community 7-8 grade division is discontinuing

Title IX Guidelines / Measurements

Proportionality: The percentage of male and female athletes must be substantially proportionate to the overall enrollment of male and female students at the institution.

or

History and Continuing Practice of Program Expansion: If a school does not meet proportionality, it can still be in compliance if it has a history and continues to expand its athletic programs for the underrepresented female or male athletes (whichever gender is underrepresented).

or

Full and Effective Accommodation of Interests and Abilities: This prong focuses on whether the school is meeting the interests and abilities of its students. This prong requires schools to assess whether the underrepresented gender has enough interest and ability to support additional athletic programs.

 - Over 85 interested students for Flag FB
 - Many sports identified by students are already offered at the HS
