I can't believe it's MARCH and that we are now in the third trimester of the school year! We still have a lot to work on and accomplish, especially as we get ready for state

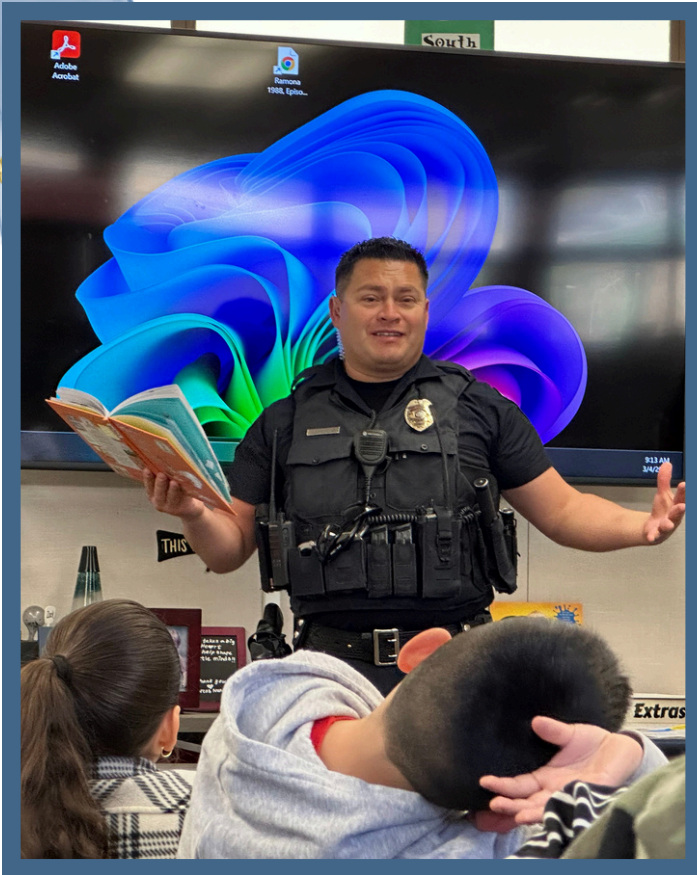
