

CLUBS & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCA'S)	CCA's are sponsored activities run by a seasonal teacher, parent, or outside hire which meet during a set season, and may incur participation fees. Clubs are generally a higher level of organization than the CCA's. They are not restricted to seasons, may meet multiple times per week or have a unique meeting schedule, may be arts or athletic in nature, and often involve student leadership roles. GRADING SYSTEM


AISJ has a **two** semester calendar year. First and second semester grades are recorded on the student's official transcript. Students are assessed for proficiency against academic competencies. A **1-7** grading scale mirrors the IB grading scale. Within this scale there are **4** mark bands reflecting AISJ reporting standards of **Exemplary (7), Proficient (6-5), Approaching (4-3)** and **Beginning (2-1)**. A score of **2** is a passing grade, earning credit. **AISJ does not weight grades or rank students.**


The Grading Scale (This is an un-weighted scale)
