NYS 3-8 ASSESSMENTS BEGIN!

We are excited for the opportunity to have our students demonstrate their growth when the NYS 3-8 ELA and Math assessments are given beginning the week of April 7. This year all students will take all their assessments using computers.

West Valley has been designated as a school in good standing across all student groups. One of the keys that allows us to be a school in good standing is our NYS 3-8 Assessment participation rate (the number of students who take the assessments). Over the last three years we have had an average of 99% of our students take the assessments.

We have been able to use the data to design professional development for our teachers and help close gaps in student learning by aligning our curriculum and instruction to meet student needs. It continues to be of critical importance that all our students participate in the assessments to allow us the best opportunity to adapt our instructional program.

As a result, out of the 22 schools in CA BOCES over the last few years, West Valley has ranked the following in performance on power standards (those being the most important):

- #1 in 3rd Grade ELA (2024), #7 (2023)
- #8 in 4th Grade ELA (2024)
- #2 in 6th Grade ELA (2023)
- #7 in 7th Grade ELA (2024), #5 (2022)
- #3- 3rd Grade Math (2024)
- #7 in 6th Grade Math (2022)
- #7 in 8th Grade Math (2024)

We are moving into our third year of curriculum development for Math and our fourth for ELA. The professional development that is responsive to the needs of our students along with our students "showing what they know" on their assessments allows for us to continue our growth and improvement. APRIL 23, 2025	Submission of Property Tax Report Card to State Education Department (by the end of the business day following budget adoption and not later than April 28, 2025); Submission of Property Tax Report Card to local newspaper.
MAY 6 - 20, 2025	Copies of the budget must be available to the residents upon request.
MAY 6, 2025	Voter Registration Day 3:00 -7:00 p.m., District Office.

THE STUFF THAT MATTERS

Our second graders have been working through a unit on matter. This unit included activities and experiences that focused on solids, liquids, and gases. As a culmination of their learning, they enjoyed the story *Bartholomew and the Oobleck* by Dr. Seuss and created their own Oobleck. Students used their senses to

make observations to determine if Oobleck is a solid or a liquid. As a result of their learning, the students determined Oobleck can be both a solid or liquid depending on the amount of pressure that is applied to it. Such fun learning!



100th Day CELEBRATION

Our first grade class celebrated the 100th day of school in a big way this year! Students created 100 day projects that were displayed in the auditorium for all to see. Mr. Amodeo interviewed each child about their project and then posted the video to our webpage and Facebook page. These projects were created at home with parent help, allowing children to practice their counting and skip-counting skills. There was a wide variety of creative projects on display for all to see.

This year, instead of a written report, students used voice-to-text to record their report. Then they added a picture and printed them. Students even built animals out of play dough and painted them, and drew and colored pictures of the animals in their habitats in art class. The children had a blast showing off their work. After that, we had a project-based day for the rest of our day with kindergarten. Students made Fruit Loop necklaces, bingo dabber gumball machines, painted flowers, played a Race to 100 game, along with other 100-themed activities. All in all, it was an awesome 100th day of school!

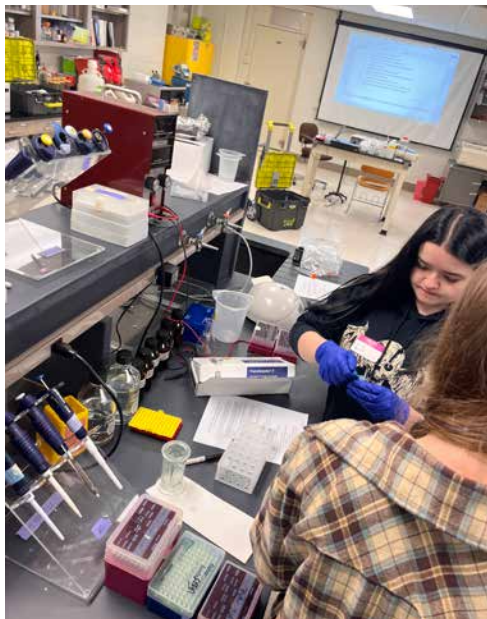

Are you interested in running for THE BOARD OF EDUCATION?

Petitions to be a candidate for a Board of Education seat are available beginning March 11, 2025, in the district office from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays.

There are three (3) seats open for election to the Board of Education.

- **Five-year term**, currently held by Heather Klahn (term expires on June 30, 2025). If elected to this seat, your term will start July 1, 2025.
- **Five-year term**, currently held by Charles Davis (term expires on June 30, 2025). If elected to this seat, your term will start July 1, 2025.
- **Remainder of a 5-year term** that was held by Gary Niesyty. His resignation resulted in the BOE appointing Melissa Pearl until the May 2025 election. The successful candidate with the most votes for this seat will start on May 21, 2025, after the vote is certified and the oath of office is completed to start their 3-year term which ends June 30, 2028.

The petition requires signatures and residences of at least 25 qualified voters. On the petition, the candidate's name and residence should be on each page of the petition.

The signed petitions must be filed with Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk, by 5:00 p.m. on April 21, 2025.

To qualify to be a board candidate you must meet the following criteria:

- A citizen of the United States
- Eighteen (18) years of age or older
- Able to read and write
- A legal resident of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one (1) year prior to the election
- Cannot be an employee of the West Valley Central School District
- The only member of his/her family (that is, cannot be a member of the same household) on the West Valley Central School District Board
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office, including, but not limited to superintendent, clerk, tax collector, treasurer or librarian, or an employee of the Board. In union free and central school districts, however, a Board member may be appointed clerk of the board and of the district
- Must not have been removed from a school district office within one (1) year preceding the date of appointment or election to the Board.

VISION

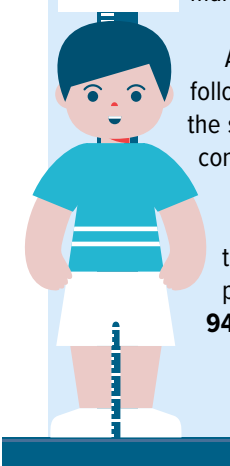
- Distance and near acuity for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K or Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11.
