

ART & ANIMATION

Today's digital production artist must rely on strong traditional art and animation skills combined with technical computer skills in order to meet the audience's visual expectations. Students will create their own 2D and 3D animations while being introduced to the tools and techniques professional artists use through a variety of hands-on projects.

AUTOMOVITE SERVICE TECHNOLOGY

The summer automotive program provides an introductory look at the four basic Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) areas: automotive electronics, engine/transmission maintenance, brakes, and suspension; with respect to basic mechanics students will have the opportunity to dive deeper into engine performance and tuning. The program prepares students for intro jobs/ apprenticeships in the automotive world

BEAUTY BASICS AT CENTRALIA BEAUTY COLLEGE (different schedule)

This course is designed to provide an abbreviated version of a few of the elements of our full-length Cosmetology program that will introduce students to the cosmetology industry. Students will learn various skills pertaining to: hair design, manicuring and pedicuring, and skin care, as well as safety and sanitation. We will provide a fun learning environment where students can express their artistic talents while at the same time learning techniques used in the industry. **Please note, this program has different session dates and times: June 24-July 16, no school July 3-7, 8:30-5:00 Tuesday through Friday.

BUSINESS & COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

This course empowers students with socially responsible business and leadership skills through immersive community experiences. Each day focuses on a key theme—ranging from equity and environmental sustainability to law, education, and economic development—allowing students to engage directly with local businesses, nonprofits, and civic leaders. Community immersion days provide real-world exposure to the intersections of business and social impact, culminating in a collaborative service project. The course concludes with a reflection on how students can apply their new skills to create positive change in their communities.

COLLISION REPAIR TECHNOLOGY

Students will get an introduction to custom body work and paint. Students will learn basic skills and hand tool usage for the automotive collision trade/custom trade. In addition students will learn about shop safety, shop maintenance, tool safety, and much more!

CONSTRUCTION TRADES (option to purchase project)

The construction projects class is for everyone! Regardless of experience, this hands-on class will give students the chance to design and build an Adirondack chair, accompanying elliptical footrest, and round side table. Students learn jobsite safety, woodworking and construction skills, and apply knowledge in physical science, math, and engineering. Additionally, students focus on employability skills and problem-solving. The course is meant to introduce students to the process of designing/building in a fun and exciting atmosphere, while learning how to work safely. Students will have the option to purchase their finished project at the end of the session. \$35/footrest, \$40/chair, \$40/table

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

This summer program provides an overview of the criminal justice system and the diverse career opportunities in this growing field, with a strong focus on police work. Students will gain real-world experience through field trips to criminal justice and law enforcement facilities and interactions with experts from local, county, and state agencies.

The curriculum covers traffic law, patrol procedures, criminal law procedures, investigative techniques, law enforcement ethics and practices, conflict resolution, and interpersonal communication and problem-solving skills. In addition, students will participate in physical training and complete PT tests throughout the summer session.

CULINARY ARTS

This program combines our summer culinary arts curriculum with on-the-job training making our summer program unique and exciting for young people. Students gain valuable hands-on experience in fundamental cooking skills, daily commercial food production, customer service, restaurant operations, food theory, and professionalism while operating the full-service delicatessen, which serves our summer school campus.

*Students must have and bring their Food Handler Permit on the first day of class; this permit must be valid for the entirety of summer school.

FAMILY HEALTH / INTRO TO NURSING

Family Health/Intro to Nursing is a summer program designed to encourage and help young people make choices that promote physical, mental, and social well-being. This course emphasizes acquiring knowledge, skills, and attitudes as a means to a healthy lifestyle and behavior. Along with the health focus students will get an introduction to nursing/medical field, focusing on topics including Anatomy and Physiology, medical terminology, vital signs, healthcare job exploration, and an overview of what our Professional Medical Careers program here at New Market offers.

JROTC - NAVY NATIONAL DEFENSE CADET CORPS

This program's mission is to instill the values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment. The summer session will serve as an introduction to the full program offered throughout the school year.

MEDICAL ASSISTANT

This course is a starting point to introduce students to a career in the medical field. Learn the languages of doctors, nurses, and health care professionals. This course involves a curriculum introducing students to medical terminology, basic clinical skills, vital signs, body systems, healthcare career exploration and various other activities.

VETERINARY ASSISTANT


This summer program is designed to give students an introduction to the animal health care field. The program includes small bits of both theory and practical application of skills and concepts such as animal restraint, terminology, anatomy, physiology, husbandry, medical nursing, and disease processes. Students gain hands-on experience and are introduced to the different educational and career opportunities in the field. While the summer program is dramatically shorter than the full year there is no opportunity to work directly with live animals, but students do get a feel of what the full year is like and they are better equipped to decide if this program is right for them!

VIDEO GAME PROGRAMMING

This class launches students into the world of writing code through the process of programming video games! The emphasis in this workshop is on learning the foundational programming concepts, including variables, conditional statements, and loops, that form the basis of game logic. Students will also be exposed to concepts in physics, graphics, and audio effects as they build a series of PC games.

WORKSITE LEARNING

Are you just finishing or just enrolling in a school-year program at New Market? Do you have a job and want to earn credit for working this summer? This is the program for you. Worksite Learning Credit is a wonderful opportunity for you to complete some of your elective credits towards graduation while you work. Students can earn .5 credits for every 180 hours worked. This summer program will run from June 26th through August 18th so students will have all summer to complete the hours necessary to get credit.



SUMMER SCHOOL COSMETOLOGY PROGRAMS

COSMETOLOGY - CENTRALIA BEAUTY COLLEGE CAMPUS

This program is a continuation of, or a start to, the full cosmetology program. This is a 15 to 18 month commitment and the training provides the 1,600 hours necessary to take the state board exam for certification. Students starting in the summer will continue their instruction in the fall and must have a 2025-2026 New Market application signed by their high school counselor. Students must be at least 16 years old, entering their junior year, and have their own transportation.

COSMETOLOGY - NEW MARKET CAMPUS

Summer session of this program is reserved for students continuing from the 24-25 school year. Students wishing to start this program need to submit a fall application to begin in September. First year students will have the same schedule as New Market programs with an AM and PM session. Students will be able to utilize the transportation provided by their sending school.

BARBERING - NEW MARKET CAMPUS

This is a 12 month commitment and the training provides the 1,000 hours necessary to take the state board exam for Barbering certification. Students starting in the summer will continue their instruction in the fall and must have a 2025-2026 New Market application signed by their high school counselor. Students must be at least 16 years old and entering their junior year. Summer schedule is: June 23-August 1 (no school July 3 & 4) Monday through Friday 8:00am to 4:30pm. School year schedule is: Monday through Friday 11:10am to 4:15pm.

MASTER ESTHETICIAN - OLYMPIA SCHOOL OF ADVANCED SKINCARE CAMPUS

This is a 12 month commitment and the training provides the 1,200 hours necessary to take the state board exam for Master Esthetician certification. Students starting in the summer will continue their instruction in the fall and must have a 2025-2026 New Market application signed by their high school counselor. Students must be at least 16 years old, entering their junior year, and have their own transportation. Summer schedule is: June 23-August 22 (no school July 3 & 4) Monday through Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm. School year schedule is: Monday through Friday 12:30 pm to 5:30pm.

THINGS TO KNOW

ATTENDANCE

Students missing more than two days will earn a failing grade. This rule applies to both excused and unexcused absences.

CLASS HOURS

Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM
There is no school on Thursday, July 3rd and Friday, July 4th.

CLOSED CAMPUS

New Market is a closed campus. Students may not leave during the day without parent/guardian permission.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students should refer to their program syllabus for electronic device policy. New Market is not responsible for theft, loss, or misplacement of personal items.

LUNCH AND NEW MARKET DELI

Students will get a 30 minute lunch break every day. They are welcome to bring lunch from home or purchase something from our New Market Deli. The Deli will be closed the first 2 days of summer session and the last 2 days so please remember to bring lunch and snacks from home those days. Students are not allowed to leave during the day as we are a closed campus.

MEDICATION

If your student is carrying medication and/or has a health safety plan, please contact New Market Skills Center's office for required paperwork. Student enrollment will not be complete until all forms have been turned in.

PROGRAM FEES

There are no program fees for our summer school programs.

REPORT CARDS

Grades will be reported to sending schools to be posted on high school transcripts and report cards will be mailed home within 2 weeks after the session.

TRANSPORTATION

School buses are not available for summer school. Transportation is the responsibility of the individual.
