Students should receive a raffle ticket if they are on time on the day of testing.

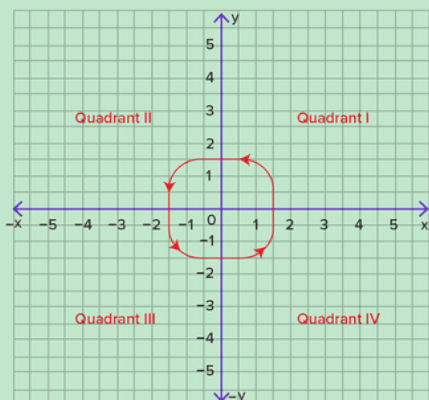
Students may receive another raffle ticket if they are following testing expectations:

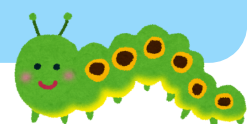
