






#### **Choose Love**

I had a great time with all the 5th Grade classes this week. The CL lesson focused on JOY and the benefits of happiness. We used the lesson you did previously with your class over Kintsugi. As you know, we focused on adding things that bring us happiness and joy to the clay heart. We talked about where our happiness comes from, the neurochemicals that are released, and that our choices belong to us therefore we are responsible for our JOY and happiness. Our scientists learned about our planet's water cycle and the phases of the moon. Our historians explored the 1900s in Texas.




#### 5th Grade

During the month of March, our readers worked on revising and editing practices and continued to improve their ability to respond to both short and extended constructed responses. Students analyzed plot elements, including introduction, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution with plot maps. Additionally, students continued building comprehension and grammar skills.

Our mathematicians prepared for their state assessment. Our students continued working diligently and with 'grit' to commit the knowledge and skills required to successfully problem solve real-world situations involving all of these 5th grade math standards.

Our scientists finished their benchmark during February and will begin to review standards in preparation for their science STAAR test.

Our historians discussed westward expansion, Indian Removal, and the Industrial Revolution.



## **6th Grade**

In 6th grade, students are working diligently to prepare for their STAAR tests in ELAR and Math. In Social Studies, they are learning about Egypt and Mesopotamia.
