#### Financial Aid Sessions for High School Seniors, April 16th

The Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority (MEFA) will host two virtual Financial Aid Offer Hotline events from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 19 and Wednesday, April 16 to help college-bound students and their families understand financial aid offers. Each student/family will meet with a financial aid expert to walk through each college financial aid offer the student has received, calculate the estimated balance due at each school, and consider their options for paying the remaining college costs. #### FEMALE ASPIRING BUSINESS SCHOLARS (FABS) SUMMER PROGRAM

<u>FABS</u> is a four-day, overnight camp offered by UD's School of Business Administration that provides young women hands-on learning through team projects, leadership experience, career exploration and mentorship. Campers will build skills essential for success in college and business, connect with peers, and experience life as a UD student.

This camp is designed for rising juniors and seniors. We invite campers of all identities, backgrounds and experiences to participate.

Location: University of Dayton campus Dates: June 22-25, 2025 Cost:

- The \$300 total cost includes lodging, meals, activity materials, camp T-shirt and water bottle.
- A \$100 nonrefundable deposit is due upon registration and is included in the total cost.
- Financial assistance is available. Families should indicate on the registration form if they would like to be considered for financial assistance, and we will contact them with additional information.

#### SUMMER ENGINEERING EXPERIENCES AT UD (SEE-UD)

<u>SEE-UD camps</u> offered by their School of Engineering provide students with an opportunity to explore the diverse fields of engineering and learn more about engineering at UD through interactive modules and hands-on lab experiences. At our three daylong camps on June 16, 17 and 18, participants will learn about a specific discipline of engineering while striving to solve problems our world faces today.

Location: University of Dayton campus

Dates: Each day features one or two engineering disciplines. Participants may attend multiple days if interested. On days with two disciplines, the sessions will run at the same time, and students will choose which session to attend.

- June 16: Choose from Mechanical Engineering or Chemical Engineering
- June 17: Engineering Technology
- June 18: Choose from Electrical and Computer Engineering or Civil Engineering

A great social and emotional Learning tip for enjoying nature is to practice mindfulness. Take time to engage all your senses when you're outdoors—focus on the sights, sounds, smells, and textures around you. This helps center your attention in the present moment, which can enhance emotional regulation, reduce stress, and foster a deeper connection to the environment. For example, you might take a few minutes to sit quietly, close your eyes, and just listen to the

natural sounds, like birds chirping or leaves rustling. This simple practice can boost your emotional awareness and resilience, and it encourages gratitude for the natural world.
