As we navigate registration for our preschool program, finalize budgets, plan end-of-year activities, and simultaneously lay the groundwork for the upcoming academic year, the pace is fast but rewarding. Updates from the March Board of Education Meeting

- <u>Central Office Bid Awarded</u> A bid was awarded to Kavi Construction for alterations to the new Board of Education Office at Walls Elementary School. Once this space is completed, we plan to lease out existing space at Walls Elementary to generate additional revenue for the district.
- <u>2025-2026 School Calendar</u> The calendar for the upcoming school year has been finalized. Please see the attached document for details, including the most significant changes for next year.
- Memorial School Time Change Effective at the start of the 2025-2026 school year, the school day at Memorial School will shift from 8:45 AM to 9:00 AM. This change will allow us to better structure our pre-kindergarten programming while minimizing disruptions across the district. We are providing ample notice to ensure families have time to adjust to the new schedule.

Budget Advocacy

Our tentative budget has been submitted to the county. While we are fortunate to have received improved state aid compared to previous years, there is still much work to be done to ensure our financial stability. To advocate for our District, Board President Miller, Board member Rebecca Higbee-lonno, District leaders, and I attended two key budget hearings before the New Jersey Legislature. On Tuesday, March 25, we testified before the Assembly Budget Committee, and on Wednesday, March 26, we presented to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee.
