Dear Jasper-Troupsburg Community,

Thank you to everyone who attended the FEMA Town Hall meeting on March 14. We had 39 participants join the discussion about our ongoing efforts to work with FEMA and secure funding for rebuilding. Our focus remains on achieving the 50% calculation necessary to meet the criteria necessary for a directed relocation. We continue to work closely with FEMA to provide all required documentation and will share updates as we move forward. To keep our community informed, we will continue to host these town hall meetings monthly to provide updates and answer questions about the rebuilding process for the Jasper building.

As part of our strategic planning process, we have identified three key priorities this year. First, we are working to improve communication, so families, staff, and community members receive timely and clear information. Second, we are enhancing school safety and security to provide a secure environment for students and staff. Third, we are aligning curriculum and instruction to support student learning and improve outcomes. We continue to work toward improvement in these areas.

To strengthen school safety, we have secured Don Shomette to conduct vulnerability assessments for each of our buildings. He will help identify areas for improvement and recommend security enhancements. In addition, he has presented his Safe & Loved program to staff, equipping them with strategies to support student well-being and safety.

Additionally, we are investing in our students' future by providing new Chromebooks for all students in grades 3-12 for the 2025-2026 school year. By utilizing BOCES to secure these devices, we can generate aid, ensuring we keep our technology up to date while making this initiative financially sustainable for the district.

Our students continue to make us proud both in and out of the classroom. This winter, our athletic teams had outstanding seasons. The JV girls basketball team won the county tournament and finished undefeated. The Varsity boys basketball team made it to the Class D finals at the Blue Cross Arena, where they competed hard against a strong Fillmore team. Our indoor track athletes also achieved several personal records, and the boys' team had a great season overall. We are excited for what's to come this spring!

We appreciate your continued support and involvement in these efforts. Our goal is to build a stronger, safer, and more effective learning environment for all students. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions. Thank you for being an integral part of our school community.

**HIGH SCHOOL NURSE'S OFFICE NEWS**

Immunization reminders: if your child is entering 7th or 12th grade next year, they are required to have the Meningitis vaccine(s). 7th graders are required to have one vaccine and 12th graders are required to have two, unless their first was given on or before their 16th birthday.

If you think there is any possibility that your child will work over the Summer, please have them stop by the Health Office to obtain an application for a working permit. A working permit is required for any student employment until age 18. Once Summer vacation starts it is difficult to obtain a permit. Please plan ahead and get your permit even if you are not sure if you will work.

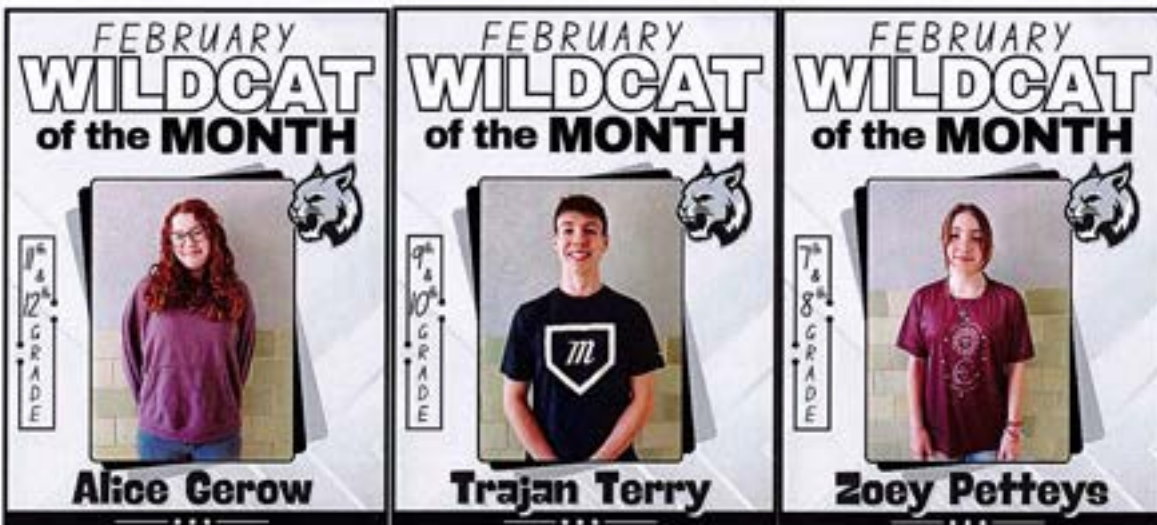
