Principal's Message:

To address low-level classroom behaviors, for the 2024-2025 school year, SHS introduced a system we call the "strike sheet." This tool allows teachers to track and manage minor behavioral issues for all students, without requiring administrative intervention. Teachers use the strike sheet for behaviors that don't escalate to a level needing administrator involvement. When a student accumulates their 4th strike within a week, a behavior referral is submitted in Infinite Campus (IC). The strikes for each student reset every week. February continued our improvement in student behavior. While we've averaged 730 strikes per month, February recorded our lowest total to date with 607 strikes. Additionally, the number of behavior referrals in IC showed a sharp decline from last year to this year: 164 referrals in February 2024 compared to just 64 referrals in February 2025. This positive change reflects the collective commitment of all stakeholders—students, parents/guardians, faculty/staff, and the community—in fostering a positive school environment that supports learning. It is imperative we continue working together for the success of our students.

In last month's newsletter, I briefly discussed learning walks (classroom observations). KCSD outlines the Core Expectations for Quality Instruction. When administrators complete classroom observations, we are looking for implementation of the four elements of quality instruction identified by the district. February learning walks showed positive gains in all four element areas and continued our positive trend for the school year. Lesson rigor and student engagement are the foundation of student growth/success and our teachers are striving for both.

For the first time in over two years, Scott had the highest student attendance rate (Month 6 attendance) among the three high schools in the KCSD. We greatly appreciate everyone's efforts in ensuring students attend school regularly and in submitting excuses for any absences/tardies. It is essential for students to attend school consistently in order to fully engage in their learning. We appreciate your continued dedication to maintaining excellent attendance and supporting your students' success.

The new era at Scott has begun.... Unfortunately for outsiders, open enrollment has already closed. Let them know they can join us next year.

Attendance:

Friendly reminder that all parents/guardians and/or doctors' notes must be turned into the front office 3 days after missing school or a tardy/check-out event. Tardy and check out events add up to full days. Please be mindful of the frequency of checking in late or out early. Students can drop notes off in the front office or in the blue attendance box located inside the bus loop doors or main entrance. NOTES FROM THE SCOTT HIGH SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE:

IS YOUR STUDENT CURRENT WITH IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS?

Please check your parent portal in IC, contact your student's doctor, and/or reach out to the school nurse if you are unsure if your student is compliant with required immunizations for school enrollment.

The most common vaccination non-compliance seen at the high school level is the 2nd Meningococcal vaccine. This is the vaccine due ON OR AFTER the student's 16th birthday.

The Kenton County School District follows the Advisory Committee on immunizations. A two week grace period is allowed to obtain required vaccination and appropriate documentation. After this two week grace period, students will be considered non-compliant and exclusion is possible.

Updated immunization certificates can be submitted via email to the school nurse, fax, or parent/student drop off. Your attention to this matter is appreciated. Thank you in advance.

OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES POLICY

Students with any of the following will not be permitted to participate in "Outside" activities":

- 5 or more discipline referrals (severity of infractions will also be taken into account).
- Failing 2 or more classes.
- 10 or more unexcused absences.
- Must be on grade level per infinite campus.



OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES POLICY cont.

Revoked privileges for "Outside Activities":

- Parking pass revoked.
- Homecoming, Prom, Senior Dinner Dance, Senior Brunch, Senior Picnic, and Pep Rally privileges revoked.



OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES POLICY cont.

Students do have the ability to earn privileges back. Each of the following may remove 1 infraction at Principal's discretion:

- Attending 3 after school detentions and abiding by all rules
- Turning cell phone in to office for 3 straight weeks
- 4 hours of school approved documented community service
