CURRICULUM CORNER



March 25, 2025

Every week I receive something called the 'Marshall Memo' that provides articles of important ideas and research in K-12 education. One of the latest memos had an article on teacher recommended Math apps and I wanted to share this information with you all.

"Math Apps and Online Tools"

In this Edutopia article, Emelina Minero recommends eleven math apps and online tools, some of which teachers have discovered during the pandemic (click the article link below for URLs of the apps):

170 Math skills and practice:

- [Moose Math](#)– This free app helps younger students practice counting, addition, and subtraction; students play math games to earn points to build a town.
- [Happy Numbers](#), preK-5 – This subscription-based website breaks down math equations and helps students understand higher-order concepts; students become dinosaurs and hatch eggs when they solve problems.
- [Prodigy](#), grades 1-8 – This free game-based website targets student weaknesses identified in its pre-assessment and tracks students' progress on them.
- [Zearn](#), grades 1-5 – A free, self-paced program aligned with Eureka Math starts with fun warm-up activities, then has timed arithmetic problems with videos on new concepts.

Open-ended math tasks:

- [Open Middle](#), preK-12 – This program leaves parts of an equation blank and asks students to make them true.
- [Would you Rather](#), preK-12 – This site has students choose between two real-life examples and make a mathematical argument for their choice.
- [Which One Doesn't Belong](#), PreK-12 – This site shows four shapes, numbers, or graphs and asks students to tell which one doesn't belong, using math vocabulary.

Rich math tasks:

- [Fraction Talks](#), grades 1-12 – A website that encourages student observation and math discussions.
- [Visual Patterns](#), K-12 – Shows the beginning of a pattern and asks students to figure out the equation to fit the pattern.

Simulation tools:

- [Applets \(couldn't find\)](#) – These are a simple code with a specific objective – for example, statistics students manipulating and identifying sampling distribution patterns in graphs.
- [Desmos](#), grades 6-12 – A website and app with interactive math activities and a graphic calculator; some teachers have been able to integrate social-emotional learning into Demos.

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

Cold & Flu Season is still lingering.....



Flu and other viruses are here and we want to remind you that children who are sick should stay home. It is very important to not spread the virus through contact on the bus or in the classroom. If your child is very tired, has a headache or stomach ache, has diarrhea or vomiting and is achy and out of sorts, he or she may have the flu or one of the many other viruses that are plentiful this year. We remind you that fruits and vegetables, exercise (especially outside in the fresh air), and plenty of sleep are the keys to staying healthy. These all help our immune systems work well. It is not too late to get a flu shot. Even if it doesn't prevent the flu, it can help with the severity and length of time you remain sick. Thank you for helping to keep our school community well.

KEEPING YOUR CHILD HOME — NOTE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE



Please review hand washing with your child. We will remind them to use their elbow for sneezes and coughs and to wash hands throughout the day. Hand washing is the single most important thing you can do to prevent yourself from getting sick. Getting enough sleep and eating healthy foods help too. Kids usually feel better first thing in the morning and body temperature is at its lowest. This is deceptive, they may still be ill. Keep your child home if they have a temperature, inflamed reddened eyes (not related to allergies), open sores on the skin or mouth (unless covered) vomiting, diarrhea, difficulty breathing, or wheezing (not improved by medication), or an unexplained rash.

We are excited to turn the corner to warmer weather, as we gear up for the upcoming baseball season. We are looking for volunteers and sponsors for both Tee Ball & Farm League, remember that these programs can't run without your help! Information and registration for each program listed below.

T-Ball - Ages 4-6

Tee ball is an introduction to baseball for girls and boys ages 4-6 (age of child is prior to August 1st, 2024) and is devoted to teaching fair play, sportsmanship fundamental skills and having fun. Tee Ball is just that batters will hit off a tee, learn baserunning, fielding positions and many other skills. Program will start with indoor sessions in March.

Farm League Baseball & Softball - Ages 6-8

Farm League is a developmental league next step up from Tee ball, which is designed to continue building on baseball fundamentals, sportsmanship, and fair play. This league will be a coach pitch and is an introduction to a more competitive environment with weekly games and practices. Farm league is for girls and boys ages 6-8 who may not be ready for Little League baseball and softball Minors program (age of child is prior to August 1st, 2024).

Softball Farm League- Dedham Gym April 14th 16th 28th & 30th - 7:00 PM – 8:00 PM

Farm League baseball- Holbrook School April 16th & 30th – 6:30 PM – 7:30 PM

Tee Ball – Holbrook School April 14th & 28th – 6:30 PM – 7:30 PM
