

### A Word from Deacon Pat Bruen



This is Deacon Pat Bruen from Boston. I miss all of the good people at Divine Child. I am in my last two months of seminary and am anxious to be back in Michigan permanently. I hope to see you when I'm home over the Easter holiday. I will be ordained a priest on June 7<sup>th</sup> and my first Mass will be June 8<sup>th</sup> at 12:30pm, at Divine Child!

Today I want to talk about suffering and hope — a good Lenten/Easter combination. When we are in the season of Lent, as Catholics we understand that this is leading to the Passion and Resurrection of Christ. We know that Good Friday is coming, but we also know Easter will follow. If we don't feel good about Christ's Passion on Good Friday, we at least know that it is temporary, and we will have Glory (and candy, of course) on Sunday. The suffering of today is tolerable because we have hope for the future.

One of the things the Lord is teaching us in this season is that our lives are very much like Lent and Easter. He wants us to reacquaint ourselves with suffering. We all have burdens. We all have suffering in our lives. But if we live with the hope of Redemption in Christ, we can better know why we suffer. We suffer for the redemption of our souls, for the love of Jesus and if we join our suffering to the Passion of Christ, our hope will grow because we will know the reward.

Jesus is showing us how to suffer. Last week, Fr. John wrote beautifully about the Stations of the Cross. The eighth station, where Jesus speaks to the women, is telling. I would have said, "Yeah, this is bad. Someone help me!!" But Jesus only tells them not to weep for him. He is concerned about others in the midst of His suffering. He knows, of course, that He is the hope for the world.

Saint Paul tells us to be joyful in our suffering and to have hope. "Not only that, but we also rejoice in our sufferings because we know that suffering produces perseverance, perseverance produces character, and character, hope." (Romans 5:3-4) Hope! Hope is one of the three Cardinal virtues: faith, hope and charity. Hope allows us to desire the happiness of Heaven even as we are going through difficult times. Hope gives us the confidence to trust in Jesus, who suffered for us, that we will be with Him in final glory. Every person wants to be happy, and hope gives us that chance to know real happiness in Christ.

Whatever suffering we have brought on ourselves as a Lenten sacrifice, this will help us to grow in holiness and give us a better inherent understanding of hope. So, when we experience pain and hardships in life, great or small, we will not give up. When we say the Divine Mercy chaplet, one of the prayers asks for the ability to "not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to your holy will." Let us carry on with hope and with great confidence!

God bless you and may the Sacred Heart of Jesus have mercy on all of us!!



Finally, those who donated **whole blood** will be eligible to donate again on 05/11/25. Power Red donors are eligible on 07/06/25.





### DC Flashback: Church Bells Installed May 24, 1963

Our bells were donated by the people of St. Casimir's parish in Detroit. They are made of bronze and one weighs four thousand pounds, the other two and the smallest weigh one thousand pounds. In June of 2010, the bells needed repairing. The biggest bell wheel assembly needed to be welded and our Carillon speakers in the tower needed to be replaced. Three of the four had not been functioning for many years.

In April of 2013, we decided to replace the motors and the chains that pull the bells to make them ring. So in May of 2013, we hired experts to come over from Germany to install these new motors and eliminate the chains. The new bell motors were replaced and no longer require chains to make them ring. They are now rung by magnetic motors and DC was the first Church in the United States to have these motors installed by the German company, Rudolf Perner & Co.

Bells have a rich history in the life of the Church, and we are very blessed to have them here at Divine Child. The bells announce that Mass begins in five minutes (which means "hurry if you are not in church yet!"). The bells also toll to announce a funeral or a marriage celebrated. In essence, the bells are a

sacramental, meaning they remind us of God's presence.

On any given day, a single bell tolls three times prior to noon and 6:00

PM. When the first bell tolls, we are called to stop and recite a particular Scripture passage and then pray a Hail Mary. When the single bell tolls again, we recite the second passage of Scripture and then a Hail Mary. When the bell tolls a third time, we recite the last passage of Scripture followed by a Hail Mary. When we are finished reciting the prayers, all three bells will toll, reminding us of the Good News of Jesus Christ. Collectively, this prayer is called the Angelus. The Angelus, Latin for "angel," is a Christian devotion in memory of the Incarnation (birth of Jesus Christ). The Angelus received its name from the Scripture passage that states, "The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary...."




Below are photos inside the bell tower of two of the three bells in the tower, and the Carillon speaker that electronically plays different songs throughout the liturgical season.

### **DCES Spotlight**

### LAUDATO SI'

Since last school year, DCES students have been involved in living the seven goals of Laudato si', Pope Francis' encyclical concerning care for our planet and care for one another. Students continue to focus on care of the earth, and this year have added another goal, reverencing the dignity of each of us. Some of their brainstorming resulted in continuing the recycling program, collecting rainwater, distributing scarves, gloves and hats to the needy, and writing Christmas notes to veterans, the homebound, and elders in nursing homes. They also have made Christmas wreaths for hospitalized veterans.

This year, emphasis is on students striving to be respectful and kind in their actions and words to all people. In school their actions are rewarded by receiving a kindness coin for each noticeable action of care and respect. Every two weeks the coins accumulated per homeroom are tallied and recognition given, by putting a star on a displayed poster. The pictures below display some of the efforts our students demonstrate in fulfilling their commitment to live Laudato si'.















### G.I.F.T. = Growing in Faith Together

During our March GIFT Program, we heard the story of Moses and the Burning Bush. We learned about Moses talking with God (prayer) and how, during Lent, we make a special effort to spend time in prayer with God. Moses helped to lead God's people out of slavery in Egypt, and during Lent we focus on how Jesus leads us out of our slavery to sin so that we can be with Him forever. We created some beautiful stained glass art with crosses, and a burning bush to remind us of our story about Moses. Our new song that we learned helps us to remember that God takes care of us, and kid-friendly Stations of the Cross were available for parents to lead their children through prayer.







### Right to Life - LIFESPAN IVF is NOT Pro-Life

In March, we praised President Trump's incredibly significant pro-life policy reforms, but we must also chide President Trump for his February 18 Executive Order titled "Expanding Access to In Vitro Fertilization." 










