

## Seabury Foundation Scholarship Application

The Seabury Foundation is a family foundation in Chicago, established in 1947 by Charles Ward and Louise Lovett Seabury. As philanthropists, they were deeply committed to the power of education to change lives. The goal of the Seabury Scholarships is to enable non-traditional students to undertake college or vocational studies who might otherwise be unable to do so. We have therefore designated these scholarships to be awarded for one academic year non-traditional students whose education has been interrupted and who have clear education and career goals. Students must reapply for the Seabury Foundation Scholarship if they wish to be considered for the following academic year after they have been initially awarded.

### The requirements and qualifications for this scholarship are:

1. Must be a degree-seeking, non-traditional student with clear education and career goals.
2. Enrolled in at least 6 credit hours in the fall or spring and/or a minimum of 3 credit hours in the summer.
3. Must achieve a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA), and complete 66% of your attempted hours to receive second semester funding.
4. Complete the FAFSA (free application for federal student aid).
5. Complete the application for admission and be pre-enrolled.

Students applying for this scholarship must include the following documents. **DO NOT** turn in the application until you have **ALL** documents. This is your responsibility. Applications with missing documents will **NOT** be considered.

- a. Seabury Application; and
- b. Copy of class schedule showing proof of enrollment for the semester you're applying for; and
- c. Copy of high school or GED transcripts if applicable; and
- d. Two reference letters from non-relatives (example: faith leader, landlord, social worker, coworker, doctor, therapist, teacher, etc.)
