Up, Up & Away with Code! Grant Brings Drone Tech to Classrooms

Belton ISD's Instructional Technology Team, led by Anna Fitzsimmons and Frank Murray, received a \$14,052 grant from the ESC Region 12 Technology Foundation to kick off *Up*, *Up* & *Away with Code!*—a dynamic new program that introduces elementary students to STEM and coding through drone technology.

With the help of the DroneBlocks curriculum, students in grades 2–5 will explore coding basics, practice problemsolving, and apply STEM concepts through interactive drone flight simulations and hands-on experiences. The initiative aligns with the District Improvement Plan and Texas Technology Applications TEKS, encouraging early interest in technology and critical thinking.

"This goes beyond just learning to fly drones," said Fitzsimmons. "It's about sparking creativity, innovation, and a love for solving problems."



41 BISD Students Advance to State History Competition

Forty-one Belton ISD students in grades 4–12 are advancing to the Texas State National History Day (NHD) competition on April 5 at the Bob Bullock Museum in Austin. Competing with 15 projects, this group represents the second-largest state delegation in district history.

NHD challenges students to explore history through research, critical thinking and creative presentations. Top finishers at state may advance to the national competition in Washington, D.C., this June.

"This work goes far beyond competition," said Social Studies Coordinator Chris Lemley. "These students are building vital research, analysis and communication skills."

Students from both campuses also attended Health Career Navigation Day at Baylor Scott & White Medical Center, where they toured hospital departments, participated in simulations and connected with healthcare professionals.
