Payton's academic achievements include induction into the National Honor Society during his sophomore year and earning Honor Roll each semester. He was selected for the Principal's Advisory Council as a freshman and participated in the NLCC Leadership Conference. He maintains a solid 4.215 GPA.



## **2025 INDUCTIONS**

This month, the Grant Chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS) is welcoming 62 new members to the organization. The inductees were selected based on their character, leadership, and willingness to serve others. As members, the inductees will be empowered with opportunities to further develop these characteristics and to leave a positive mark on our school and community, all while balancing their academics as they are required to maintain a 3.5 unweighted grade point average and be passing their academic classes.

All NHS members volunteer in a minimum of six hours of ongoing service per quarter. This can include being a Big Dawg mentor during TEAM, a peer tutor in one of the academic

labs, or volunteering with a community organization. Members are also expected to volunteer for five separate events throughout the school year. This year, members have served at Back to School Night, Lake Villa Fall Festival, Fox Lake Pumpkin Jubilee, numerous feeder school events, and 8th Grade Enrollment Night among many others. The NHS advisers, officers, and current members look forward to working with the 2025 inductees!

## ACT Testing

On Tuesday, April 8, Grant Community High School students in grades 9-11 will take the state mandated ACT (Juniors), Pre-ACT Secure (Sophomores), or Pre-ACT (Freshmen) test at school. This assessment opportunity gives our students a chance to measure their academic achievement and readiness for college and career, whether they're going to college or into the workforce. All freshmen, sophomores, and juniors are expected to be in attendance on that day for the exam. The ACT exam is a part of the state graduation requirements. Seniors will not report to school, and are encouraged to use the day to explore future options.

Buses will run typical routes on the morning of April 8. The school day will begin at 7:40 AM with students reporting to their assigned testing locations. Freshmen and sophomores should finish testing at 11:00 AM and will be released with buses running typical routes. Juniors will complete testing at 12:00 PM, and normal bus transportation home will be provided at that time. Students with accommodations will be released at different times, which the office of special education will

communicate individually with those families.

After spring break, students will receive a letter identifying the classroom and teacher for their assessment day. All room assignments will also be posted in the hallways on the day of testing. Juniors will be given directions to create a MyACT account as part of their non-test experience the week of March 31. Please encourage your student to complete all questions, including listing up to four colleges where they can send their scores for free, before the test.

Materials needed for testing day include:

- Student ID
- Fully charged Chromebook
- Chromebook charging cord
- A calculator. If you are not sure that your calculator is a type that is permitted, please check the <u>ACT website</u>.

Parents and guardians can help students do their best on the test by encouraging the following:

- Attend school and be on time on the day of testing
- Get a good night's sleep before testing
- Eat breakfast on the morning of testing

Please remind them why taking the ACT matters: it can help them measure academic growth; it gives them information on careers they might enjoy; and their scores can lead to scholarship and financial aid opportunities for college.

We want all students to have a positive experience with the test. If you have questions about the required testing, contact the Office of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment at (847) 973-3800. You can also visit the <u>ACT website</u> for more test-taking tips, and free practice tests can be found on <u>ACT Practice Test</u> section of their website.

## Hall of Fame

#### Nomination Information

The Hall of Fame has been established to recognize and showcase outstanding graduates and dedicated staff as part of our efforts to promote excellence and achievement for learners in Grant Community High School District 124.

The Hall of Fame was designed to honor exemplary individuals who have achieved distinction, outstanding accomplishment, or significant contribution within their professions, communities, schools, families, or personal lives.

#### Nominations

Nominations will be accepted for the Hall of Fame, Class of 2025, until April 25, 2025. Visit <u>GCHS Hall of Fame</u> for the nomination forms.

#### Criteria to be Considered for Alumni

- Graduates of Grant Community High School are eligible for consideration, provided that graduation occurred at least ten years prior to the year in which they are nominated.
- Graduate has made a significant contribution within their profession, community, school, family, or personal life.
- Graduate positively promotes Grant Community High School.

#### Criteria to be Considered for Staff

- Staff of Grant Community High School are eligible for consideration if they have a minimum of twenty years of service to District 124 and provided they are either retired or have ceased active employment at least three years prior to the year in which they are nominated.
- Staff member has made a significant contribution at Grant Community High School, in their community, family, or personal life.
- Staff member positively promotes Grant Community High School.

#### Procedures for Nominations

- Nominations may be made by families, friends, alumni, faculty, staff, administration, and community members of District 124.
- In order to be considered, the nomination form should be fully completed and submitted as outlined on the form.
- Nominations will be kept on file and considered for a total of five years following submission. After five years, a candidate may be re-nominated.

#### **Selection of Inductees**

- The selection committee is comprised of a member of the Board of Education, administration, staff, alumni of Grant Community High School District 124, and community members.
- Selected inductees will be contacted by July 1, 2025.

#### Induction

- New members of the Hall of Fame will be inducted at a ceremony during Homecoming Week 2025.
- New members will be asked to participate in a variety of Homecoming activities, including a reception and awards ceremony at a meeting of the Board of Education, an all-school pep assembly, the varsity football game, and the Homecoming parade. While the intent of this program is to honor graduates and Grant staff, it is also to provide positive role models and inspiration for current students.

Tickets are nonrefundable and non-transferable. Out-of-school guest forms are due no later than Wednesday, April 9th. This year's Prom, A Splash of Elegance, is quickly approaching! Prom is Friday, May 2, and the destination is the Belvedere Banquets in Elk Grove Village, IL. In order to attend Prom, students must be a Junior or Senior currently enrolled at GCHS. Students wishing to bring a Freshman, Sophomore, or out-ofschool guest are allowed. Students bringing an out-ofschool guest will need to complete the <u>Grant Dance</u> <u>Guest Approval Form</u>. Out-of-school guest forms must be completed and turned in to the Deans by Wednesday, April 9.

Tickets to the event will be sold at \$80.00 per ticket. Prom tickets will be on sale online or in the Bookstore from April 10 through April 17. Only check and cash payments can be made in the Bookstore. All GCHS Senior and Junior Students must purchase tickets individually. Senior and Junior Students may not purchase two tickets under the same ID#. If you are purchasing a ticket for your date who is an underclassman (Sophomore/Freshman) or out-of-school guest, you must use that student's name and student ID#. Seniors/Juniors who are bringing a guest are responsible for their guests. When purchasing tickets for you and your guest, please select the appropriate ticket purchase. Students who have been approved to bring an outside guest will select the Senior/Junior taking an out-of-school guest ticket. If your guest has not been pre-approved, the student will not be allowed to attend.

Prom is a school function; all school rules and regulations, as stated in the Student/Parent Handbook, apply to all students attending prom. Students who behave improperly will be referred to a GCHS administrator and parents will be notified. All students and guests will be required to ride school-sponsored bus transportation to and from Prom. This bus transportation is included in the price of the ticket and is mandatory. Students are not allowed to utilize private transportation to or from Prom. Students who do so will not be admitted to Prom.

Prom check-in will begin in the Field House at 4:45 PM on Prom night. Students must present their ticket and current ID upon check-in to the Prom. Outside guests must present a valid state-issued photo ID to be admitted to Prom. Students who do not have proper identification will not be allowed to board a bus. Buses will depart beginning at 5:30 PM. All students must be present for the entire school day on Friday, May 2, in order to attend Prom. No absences, tardies, or passes off campus will be excused for students attending Prom.



# DO YOU KNOW THAT CANNABIS TAKES MANY FORMS?

#### > Myths abound.

Do you want to verify cannabis "facts" that your teen has told you to make sure they are accurate? For instance, is cannabis addictive? (It is.) Are you curious to know the short-term versus long-term effects of cannabis use? For more information, including drug data, check out the website of the National Institute of Health's (NIH) National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA): <u>https://nida.nih.gov/publications/drugfacts/</u> <u>cannabis-marijuana</u>.

#### > Even plants can be harmful.

THC is tetrahydrocannabinol, the main psychoactive ingredient in cannabis that makes a person feel "high." Cannabis plants are now being grown with a much higher concentration of THC in them than there has ever been. THC content in the 60s to the 80s was less than 2 percent. Since then, it has increased by more than 200 percent (17 percent-28 percent THC).
