Capital Campaign

Highlights from the Capital Campaign Meeting on March 23, 2025

Father De addressed the parish on March 23 with an update on our Growing Faithfully Capital Campaign.

Below are some highlights from the meeting:

- The campaign has successfully garnered pledges of roughly \$5 million, with a little over \$2 million actually received at this point.
- The original building project total was \$8,255,480, which would have included new handicapped-accessible covered drop areas for the front and back areas of the church, an expansion of Green Hall, enclosure of the northern breezeway, a new music and choir room, 8 new classrooms, additional church meeting space, new administrative offices for the school, additional restrooms, and a large, multipurpose building area to be used for worship, sports, and larger church gatherings.
- Considering the numbers above, a loan in the amount of \$3,530,000 would be required. The Vestry has decided that the monthly payment on such a loan would put a financial strain on the church and inhibit our ability to honor our mission statement; specifically limiting our ability to help others.
- In light of this financial strain, the Vestry is now opting for a more limited building project costing roughly \$6,240,650. This would entail a loan of \$1,530,000 with a monthly payment of \$11,635, or \$139,620 annually. This adjusted plan will include a new driveway and parking area on the south end of the property, new handicapped-accessible covered drop areas in the front and rear of the church, new music/choir room, new school admin offices, new meeting area, 2 new classrooms, some new restrooms, a "shelled" second floor in the school that can be expanded in the future, an open air pavilion (in lieu of a multipurpose building) and not enclosing the north-facing breezeway.

A note from Junior Warden Bruce Stone

Our Growing Faithfully Capital Campaign building and renovation project is presently scheduled to begin in May with the addition of the covered entrance/driveway in front of the Church. As we get closer to commencing, you will see other changes and improvements to the Church campus as well. The Projects Committee has recently made the decision to remove all of the trees in the median between the upper and lower parking lots parallel to the front of the Church office. Unfortunately, one of those trees is dead, and another is dying. Due to the amount of shade provided by those those trees, combined with their exposed roots, the grass has not grown there in many years and has become unsightly. At this time, our plans are to re-plant after the covered entrance construction is completed with two new live oaks anchoring each end of the median, with a sustainable and suitable ground cover, and possibly some low-lying evergreen type shrubs. It is presently our plans to salvage a live oak located on campus which will need to be removed for construction, and relocate to the median as one of the replacements. We don't expect any interruptions to parking, as the work will of course be done on weekdays.

In preparation for Easter, we have recently had all of the windows in the Sanctuary and Chapel cleaned, as well as those exteriors power-washed. We have also recently replaced the large Sacristy window and 2 small windows in the sanctuary which were approaching the end of their life!!

I will continue to provide updates on improvements to the Church grounds as we progress, and embark on our exciting building plans!



Lenten Concert Series - Rebekah Atkinson, harp April 8 at 12:05 PM

Bob Chilcott's *St. John Passion*Palm Sunday, April 13 at 4:00pm

The St. James Adult choir will present Bob Chilcott's setting of the Passion in an hour-long work telling the story of Christ's trial and Crucifixion using the text from St John's Gospel. It was written specially for Matthew Owens and the Choir of Wells Cathedral for performance within a Cathedral Service on Palm Sunday, 23 March 2013. It is the austerity, the agony, and ultimately the grace of this story that inspired Chilcott to write this piece.

As in the great Passion settings by J. S. Bach, the story is narrated by a tenor Evangelist. Chilcott designed the narrative to be sung in an arioso style that gains momentum as the drama unfolds. The role of the choir within the narrative is to play the part of the crowd or a group of soldiers who comment from time to time in short outbursts. The larger role for the choir is the singing of four meditations that punctuate various points in the drama. These meditations are written in a simple and melodic way. The texts are taken from English poems from the thirteenth to the early seventeenth centuries that express deeply human responses to death, to life, and to man's relationship with the world and with God. Two of these meditations are sung by the choir with soprano solo, the last of which ('Jesus, my Leman') expresses most poignantly the human response to seeing Christ crucified on the Cross. There are also five well-known Passiontide hymn texts ('It is a thing most wonderful', 'Drop, drop, slow tears', 'Jesu, grant me this, I pray', 'There is a green hill far away', and 'When I survey the Wondrous Cross'), which are designed to be sung by the choir and congregation together.

The St. James Concert Series presents Bob Chilcott's ST. JOHN PASSION

About the Composer:

Bob Chilcott (b.1955) is a British composer who is hailed by The Observer as 'a contemporary hero of British choral music', composer and conductor Bob Chilcott has enjoyed a lifelong connection with singing and choirs. He sang in the choir of King's College, Cambridge as a chorister and choral scholar, and in the vocal group The King's Singers. He is Principal Guest Conductor of the BBC Singers and is conductor of the Birmingham University Singers. As a composer he has a large catalogue of music published by Oxford University Press that reflects his broad view of musical styles and genres. He has collaborated with several writers, principally the poet Charles Bennett, with whom he wrote *The Angry Planet*, composed in 2012 for the BBC Proms, and *The Voyage*, commissioned by Age UK, and nominated for a Royal Philharmonic Society Award. Chilcott's works are widely recorded by many groups including The Sixteen, Tenebrae, The King's Singers, The Choir of King's College, Cambridge, Westminster Abbey Choir, Wells Cathedral Choir, Ora, Commotio, and the Houston Chamber Choir. In 2016 he collaborated with the celebrated singer songwriter Katie Melua and the Gori Women's Choir on the album *In Winter*, and his most recent recording collaborations are with The Choir of Merton College, Oxford with *Christmas Oratorio* on Delphian, and St Martin's Voices on Resonus.


