## Significant Art Changes

### Elementary

- The format was changed for the elementary curriculum.
- The long artist biographies at the end of each grade level were removed and will be added to the appendix. These biographies were shortened and placed in the Grade Level Artists table.

### **Middle School**

 New course – Art Concepts was developed using the sixth grade curriculum from the adopted Elementary Art Curriculum.

## Significant Art Changes

### **High School**

- Essential Topics, which are covered in every high school art course, were removed from individual courses and placed at the beginning of the high school curriculum. This includes the eight studio habits of mind and four essential learnings (creating, presenting, responding, and connecting).
- For all courses with two semesters, the course overview states that semester one must be completed before taking semester two.
- Alaska Native Arts clarifies that students may also be introduced to non-Indigenous Alaskan artists.
- Art Workshop may be used for a beginning level through a level four, capstone course.

The proposed Art Curriculum for grades K-12 is ready for consideration by the School Board for adoption. The administration's recommendation is to adopt the proposed curriculum.

The proposed Art Curriculum has followed the established revision process outlined in AR 910. The research and review stage began in the 2023-24 school year. At that time, art teachers from across the district met to discuss the curriculum, and reflect on the relevance of the currently adopted curriculum and whether it continues to meet the needs of students and teachers. They also considered community input, and researched current trends and best practices.

The proposed curriculum went through two drafts; the first was released for public comment in October 2024 and draft two had minimal changes based on public comment for draft 1. Throughout the process, feedback was solicited from a variety of stakeholders, including administrators, teachers, parents, students, the Board Curriculum Committee, UAF faculty, and community organizations such as the Fairbanks Native Association, Tanana Chiefs Conference, and the Fairbanks NAACP. On multiple occasions, Teaching and Learning also met with art teachers to discuss the drafts. The curriculum writers reviewed and considered all feedback in order to guide revisions of the next draft.

The final draft is a strong document and reflects the priorities of the School Board's Strategic Plan, as well as the input provided throughout the process. It outlines a comprehensive plan for educating students, and is aligned to the <u>National Core Arts Standards</u> and the <u>Alaska Arts</u> <u>Standards</u>.

At that time, world language teachers from across the district met to discuss the curriculum, and reflect on the relevance of the currently adopted curriculum and whether it continues to meet the needs of students and teachers. They also considered community input, and researched current trends and best practices.

In this proposal, the curriculum for grades K-8 remains the same as the adopted curriculum. The proposed curriculum for high school went through one draft and was released in August and September of 2024. Throughout the process, feedback was solicited from a variety of stakeholders, including administrators, teachers, parents, students, the Board Curriculum Committee, UAF faculty, and community organizations such as the Fairbanks Native Association, Tanana Chiefs Conference, and the Fairbanks NAACP. On multiple occasions, Teaching and Learning scheduled meetings with world language teachers to discuss the drafts. All feedback was reviewed and considered

The final draft is a strong document and reflects the priorities of the School Board's Strategic Plan, as well as the input provided throughout the process. It outlines a comprehensive plan for educating students, and is aligned to the National ACTFL Standards and the Alaska World Languages Standards. The Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's World Language curriculum was used as a foundation for the FNSBSD high school curriculum, levels 1-4.
