DATA FOCUS

We have just completed our grade level RTI meetings led by April Russell, our Title Teacher.


This is a large undertaking where each grade level team meets every 6 weeks to review reading and math student progress monitoring data. Individual student data is reviewed to determine whether each student is successfully responding to intervention or whether small group skill instruction needs to be modified to better address needs.

These graphs provide a visual to show the average progress of one grade level RTI group of students.



The RTI team looks carefully at the progress of each individual student. Vertical change lines indicate a change or new intervention. If a student has data points that track below the trend line, the team will discuss current intervention, assessment data and student needs/concerns. At this time the child's intervention will be modified. If a student has 3 or more data points above the trend line, the intervention is considered successful and the student may be exited from RTI progress monitoring.




