### UNSOLVED MYSTERIES: MALAYASIA AIRLINES FLIGHT 370

## RECIPES

#### APPLE CINNAMON CHIMICHANGAS

CREATED BY PHOEBE AYLESTOCK (6TH)

#### Ingredients:

1 (21 ounce) can apple pie filling
½ cup cinnamon sugar
15 (6 inch) flour tortillas
1½ cups oil for frying
15 toothpicks



#### Instructions:

- **1-** Heat the apple pie filling in a small pot over medium-low heat until warmed through, about 5 minutes.
- **2-** Place cinnamon sugar in a shallow
- **3-** Spoon 1 1/2 tablespoons filling into the center of each tortilla. Fold the sides in and over filling, then roll up like a burrito. Use a toothpick to secure it.
- **4**-Heat oil in a large, deep saucepan over medium heat.
- 5- Working in batches, fry tortillas, seam-side down, in hot oil until browned and crispy, 1 to 2 minutes per side. Blot on paper towels. Remove toothpicks and roll chimichangas in cinnamon sugar to coat.

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup water
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 3 tablespoons strawberry Jell-O




#### Instructions:

- 6. Serve with whipped cream.


